HALL CHARGES AN 'ABOUT FACE'

Says That Keenan at First Supported Hancher

Mason City, Ia.—(P)—W. Earl Hall, state Board of Education member, issued the following statement in reply to a Cedar Rapids story quoting the opposition of T. W. Keenan of Shenandoah, Ia., another board member, to Virgil M. Hancher, president-elect of the University of Iowa: “The complete answer to Mr. Keenan’s claims is contained in the proceedings of the Board of Education. They show that Mr. Keenan voted for Mr. Hancher on two occasions and that as late as 6 o’clock on the evening of the last board meeting two weeks ago, he was unreservedly for Iowa’s president-elect.

“On this occasion Mr. Keenan read a letter he had written to an Iowa alumnus in which in firm language he characterized the case against Mr. Hancher as an obvious shakedown. “He referred to Mr. Hancher’s topmost rating, both as to professional ability and personal integrity, in the universally accepted legal directory and contrasted it with that of opposing counsel.

Attacked Lawyers
“He pointed to the fact that a maximum recovery for the plaintiff in the action against Hancher and his associates on a basis of holdings would be around \$17, a small fraction of the cost of the suit. This Mr. Keenan interpreted as reflecting an unmistakable attempt on the part of the rival lawyers, whom he referred to as ‘lunatics,’ to gain control of the investment company’s assets.

“He stated unequivocally that while he had not had previous information about Mr. Hancher’s involvement in the suit, such knowledge would not in any sense have detracted from his belief that Mr. Hancher is abundantly qualified to direct the destinies of the university.

BRITISH BOMBS WRECK NAZI, ITALIAN BASES

Targets in Heart of Berlin Are Hit by Air Raiders

London—(U.P.)—Big British bombing fleets smashing at “both ends of the Axis” bombed big war industry centers in Northern Italy and blasted with dive-bombing attacks on targets in the center of Berlin until fires were started, the air ministry said Monday.

The great Fascist motor and electric works and steel plants at Milan, Turin and Aosta as well as the huge railway yards at the Moabit station in Berlin and other targets in “the center of the city” were bombed by the British air fleets, the communique said.

Two attacks, one of three hours and the other of more than one hour, ending at 4 a. m., were made on Berlin despite heavy ground fire.

Coastal Bases Raided

The British bombing offensive appeared to have been the most intensive and widespread of the war and it coincided with intensive air attack on the Dutch, Belgian and French coastal bases held by the Germans. A great red glow like “a prairie fire” was reported seen over the French coast opposite Dover, where British air-planes had bombed Nazi long-range gun emplacements during the night.

One heavy bomber, making a shallow dive through the German barrage, held its course until 2,000 feet above Berlin’s rooftops, where it dropped a stick of heavy bombs that “fell dead across an important objective in the very heart of the city, straddling it from south-east to northwest, and partly setting it afire.”

(The Anhalter railroad station in the center of the German capital and near Adolf Hitler’s chancellery was bombed in previous raids.)

Duce in Area

The communique said that the British planes started early in the evening on their 1,600 mile flight to bomb the big Italian industrial centers, crossing the Alps twice. They reached their targets at Turin and Milan soon after midnight. Premier Benito Mussolini is now inspecting troops in north Italy.

Other British bombers raided naval docks at Hamburg and Wilhelmshaven, dropping heavy bombs which were believed to have hit a German warship.

“Bombs also were dropped on oil refineries at Cologne and Gelsenkirchen and aluminum works at Cologne. Grevenbroich and various objectives in the Ruhr Valley,” the communique said.


“The Krupp works at Essen and the ports of Rotterdam and Antwerp and Flushing as well as several enemy airdromes were bombed.”

One British plane (reportedly shot down in Berlin) was said to be missing. The coastal command reported that one of its Lockheed planes shot down a German air-planes over the North Sea Sunday.

Naval Guns Join Attack

Military targets over Germany generally, and the invasion ports along the English Channel, were bombed. Big British raiding fleets cruised over Berlin and the industrial islands of Northern Italy.

PIONEER DIES AT AGE OF 96

Peter Stillmunkes Passes at Home in Sherrill

Peter Stillmunkes, 96, one of Dubuque’s oldest and most prominent residents, died at his home in Sherrills Sunday evening at 6:15 o’clock. He had been ill for about a month.

The body is at the Behr Funeral Home here, where it will remain until Tuesday noon, when it will be transferred to the home in Sherrills. The funeral will be held from the home to Sts. Peter and Paul Church at 10 o’clock Wednesday morning. Burial will be in the cemetery at Sherrills.

Born in Westphalen

Mr. Stillmunkes, a pioneer of Dubuque County, was born in Westphalen, Germany, on Jan. 7, 1844. At the age of two years he came to this country with his parents, and had lived in this county ever since.

In June, 1867 he married Miss Elizabeth Wieland, who died in 1907. Ten children were born to this union. On Sept. 11, 1931, he was married to Miss Cecile Schmitt.

Served in Legislature

Mr. Stillmunkes served two terms as representative from Dubuque County in the state legislature, having been elected the first time in 1892. For 67 years he served as secretary of the Independent School Board of Jefferson Township. He was prominent in banking circles throughout the state, having been connected with various financial institutions.

The Survivors

Besides his wife, Mr. Stillmunkes is survived by the following children: Mrs. Mary Link, Big Lake, Minn.; Mrs. Charles (Louise) Link, Waukon, Ia.; John Stillmunkes, Dubuque; Joseph Stillmunkes, Albuquerque, N. M.; Dr. William B. Stillmunkes, St. Louis, Mo.; and Mrs. George (Laura) Brown, Los Angeles, Calif.

Preceding him in death were three sons, Frank, Paul, and George, his first wife, one daughter, Mrs. John (Kate) Conrad, and three sisters.

GUILTY PLEA BY WOMAN IN PERJURY CASE

Sentence Is Suspended; Rev. Lyerly Gets 24-Hour Delay

Mrs. William (Marie) Fransen, 665 Central Avenue, one of four persons indicted on perjury charges after an investigation by that District Court Grand Jury of Dubuque’s marriage mill, was placed on probation when she pleaded guilty before Judge Milton J. Glenn late Monday morning.

The Rev. J. Nevin Lyerly, pastor of the Immanuel Congregational Church, Eighteenth and Jackson Streets, the only other one of the four named in the indictments who had been arrested Monday, appeared before Judge Glenn earlier Monday morning and, through his attorney, obtained 24 hours in which to either enter a plea or file a demurrer to the indictment.

Sentence Suspended

After Mrs. Fransen had entered a plea of guilty, Judge Glenn said that there was no alternative under the Iowa law but to give her an indeterminate sentence of not more than 10 years in the Women’s Reformatory at Rockwell City, but that he would suspend this sentence and place Mrs. Fransen on probation. The court informed Mrs. Fransen, however, that it would be expected that she would be available as a witness before the grand jury for the January, 1941, term of District Court should that grand jury continue the investigation of the marriage mill and alleged cases of perjury committed in connection with the obtainment of marriage licenses in the county for couples from out of the state.

Arrested Saturday

Both the Rev. Mr. Lyerly and Mrs. Fransen were arrested Saturday afternoon, shortly after the indictments had been returned by the grand jury. The pastor filed bonds of \$500 for his release a short time after he was arrested, but Mrs. Fransen remained prisoner in the police matron’s quarters of the City Hall until Sunday evening, when bonds in a similar amount were filed for her release.

In answering questions by the court her plea of guilty had been entered Monday morning by her attorney. Mrs. Fransen said she had signed four affidavits to obtain out-of-the-state couples to enable marriage licenses at the marriage mill, that she did not know any of the persons for whom she signed affidavits, and that she had signed them at the request of two marriage mill “spotters” whose names she gave as “Connie” Bergman and “Jack” Drexel.

What Indictment Charged

The indictment charges Mrs. Fransen with making a false affidavit by which John Gulmbre, Fenimore, Wis., obtained a marriage license June 14, 1940, to marry Marcelle Henewig, also of Fenimore, when Gulmbre already had a wife. It was explained by court attaches that at the time the marriage license was issued Gulmbre’s wife had a petition for divorce pending in the Circuit Court of Grant County, Wis., but that the divorce had not yet been granted.

ton county, which office he held for three consecutive terms. Upon his taking office the family retired from the farm and moved to a home he had purchased in Webster City. Later, Mr. Sterling was elected to the Iowa Legislature and served as a member of the House in the Thirty-eighth and Thirty-ninth sessions of the General Assembly. After retiring from business he served as Justice of the Peace for eight years.

In politics he was a Republican and he was an active member of the Congregational church.

Mr. Sterling was quiet in manner, yet sincere and honest in his convictions and he was looked upon by his host of friends and acquaintances as a man deserving confidence and one who always stood ready to give of his best and untiring service to his community, to his county, and to the state.

Mrs. Sterling passed away May 8, 1936, after which time Mr. Sterling made his home with his children. Although past seventy-six years of age he continued to enjoy fairly good health and was active in going about among his friends. He always maintained an interest in and was much concerned in world affairs; and only about an hour before his death he listened to a news broadcast and later discussed the affairs of the day with a daughter with whom he was residing at the time. He then retired for the night and shortly afterward he was found to have suffered a stroke from which he could not survive. He passed away May 12, 1939.

He leaves to mourn his loss, two sisters, Mrs. C. E. Chapin, of Bloomington, Illinois, and Mrs. F. M. Thompson of Paxton, Illinois; four daughters, Mrs. Luale Brock and Miss Rachel Sterling of Spencer, Iowa; Mrs. M. F. McKee of Webster City, Iowa, and Mrs. Perry Parker of Peoria, Illinois; and two sons, Sam Sterling of Bloomington, Illinois and Dr. L. P. Sterling of Zearing, Iowa, besides a host of admiring friends in his home community and many acquaintances in the state at large.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Forty-ninth General Assembly, That in the passing of the Honorable John C. Sterling, the state has lost a valued and honored citizen and the House, by this resolution, tenders its sympathy to the members of his family in their sorrow.

His death occurred on October 20, 1940, and he is survived by his wife and following children: Mrs. Mary Link, Big Lake, Minn.; Mrs. Charles (Louise) Link, Waukon, Iowa; John Stillmunkes, Dubuque, Iowa; Joseph Stillmunkes, Albuquerque, New Mexico; Dr. William B. Stillmunkes, St. Louis, Missouri; and Mrs. George (Laura) Brown, Los Angeles, California. Preceding him in death were three sons, Frank, Paul and George, his first wife, and one daughter, Mrs. John (Kate) Conrad.

Mr. Stillmunkes, a life-long member of the Democratic party, was elected as Representative in the lower House, serving two terms during the Twenty-fourth and Twenty-fifth sessions of the General Assembly.






