

DEATH OF HON. T. B. MILLER


Prominent and Useful Citizen An-

Hon. T. B. Miller of Stanwood pass-
 ed away Thursday morning. His death
 was sudden and entirely unexpected.
 He has been in his apparent usual
 good health and about eight o'clock
 that morning started down town. On
 the way he stopped at the Simmons
 home and while on the porch convers-
 ing with a number who were present
 his head dropped forward and by the
 time those near could reach him death
 had ensued.

The funeral services were held Sat-
 urday afternoon and were attended by
 hundreds of people who came to pay
 a last tribute of respect and affection
 for one who had lived a long and use-
 ful life in the community.

"Tom" Miller, as he was known to
 every one, was born in Ohio in 1841.
 He enlisted in the 16th Ohio inf. and
 served three years and three months
 in the war of the Rebellion. He came
 to Cedar county in the fall of 1865 and
 his residence here continued until the
 time of his death. He represented this
 county in the legislature one term and
 was frequently honored by an elec-
 tion to town and school offices. He
