due the insurrection in the North, only to return two days later and meet his death on the 9th, near Agua Fria; here, on the succeeding day, Jose Gonzales, a Pueblo Indian of Taos, was installed as governor of New Mexico, soon after to be executed by order of Armijo; here, in the principal reception room, on Aug. 12, 1846, Captain Cooke, the American envoy, was received by Governor Armijo and sent back with a message of defiance; and here, five days later, General Kearney formally took possession of the city, and slept, after his long and weary march, on the carpeted earthen floor of the palace.

When General Lew Wallace went to New Mexico in 1879 as territorial governor he found the history of the old building an unending source of delight. The stories of plots, of murders, of executions, of battles that had raged about its stout walls, were a constant source of inspiration, and he strongly advocated that Washington should not permit this building to pass from national control. The post of governor left the general sufficient leisure to write his now famous book, "Ben Hur," and he always declared that the romance of his surroundings did much to keep him in the right mood for a work of the kind.

The following day, New Years, he was seated in a chair in his home and death came almost on the instant, of heart trouble. He was 66 years, 1 month and 8 days of age at the time of
