## A. M. Utterback, Hedrick Dies Here

Adna M. Utterback of Hedrick, 91, well known cattle buyer and stockman and long-time Hedrick resident, died Monday morning at 7:30 o'clock at the Kensler nursing home here, where he had been a patient two weeks.

Mr. Utterback was born April 9, 1860 near Sigourney, and was a son of Josiah and Frances Utterback, prominent pioneer Sigourney residents. His entire life was spent in Keokuk county and he was prominent in civic affairs in Hedrick as long as his health permitted.

He was married to Julia Hayes, who preceded him in death in 1934. Later he married Mrs. Florence Taylor, who survives him.

Also surviving are three daughters, Mrs. Alta Ries of Hedrick, Mrs. Blanche Smith of Santa Ana, California and Mrs. Ruth Scholey of Glendale, California; one son, Fred A. of Glendale, California; nine grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren and one sister, Mrs. Rosa Hauser of Pasadena, California. Mr. Utterback an uncle of Mrs. C. A. Lyons of Sigourney.

A son, Hubert A. Utterback, former justice of the Iowa supreme court, preceded him in death.

The funeral service is being held this afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Hedrick Presbyterian church, in charge of the Rev. John G. Ballensky, assisted by the Rev. C. S. Whitehouse. Burial will be in Pennington cemetery, south of Sigourney.





# UTTERBACK-HAYES FAMILY

Josiah Utterback, born 1834 in Indiana, came to this area in 1850. He married Frances E. Dyer in 1854. She was born in 1838 and died in 1902. They were the parents of 8 children: Gilbert, 1858; Adna, 1860; Edward and Edith, twins, 1865; Addie, 1867; Emma, 1870; Josie and Rosa, twins, 1879.

Adna Utterback married Julia E. Hayes of Hayesville in 1879. She was born in 1860 and died in 1934. Julia was the daughter of Joel Winthrop Hayes and Esther Broliar Hayes. Brothers and sisters of Julia were Mary Hayes; Daniel Hayes who married Katie Richardson; Delia Hayes who married S. H. Gaston, postmaster at Hayesville; George Hayes, the first sheriff of Keokuk County, who married Nettie Higgins and then Ella Rowley. Julia's mother was previously married to Andy Wertz and they had Mary Wertz who married Judson Doggett; Frank; Matthew; Delilah Wertz who married Noah Jacobs; Bertie Wertz who married Doc Quinn and Eva who married Frank Utterback.

Adna Utterback and Julia Hayes Utterback had 5 children: Hubert who married Edith Gwynne and then Cora Prine; Blanche who married Edward Lee Smith; Alta who married Jesse James Ries; Fred who married Della Bartlett and Ruth who married John McWilliams. Grandchildren of the Utterbacks were: Esther Utterback Penquite; Gretchen Utterback Ashby; Edward Lee Smith II; Robert Smith; Richard Stanley Ries; Roger Utterback Ries and Virginia Maurine Ries Orman.

Adna was a banker in Hedrick and owner of the famous Kite Race Track. Julia Hayes Utterback, a cousin of Rutherford B. Hayes thus since their issue are paternal cousins of Abraham Lincoln, they can claim kinship with two U.S. Presidents, an unusual honor.

Hubert Utterback, son of Adna and Julia Utterback, was Judge of the Des Moines district and served as U.S. Congressman and on the Iowa Supreme Court. He was

educated at Hedrick Normal and Commercial College and Drake University.

Richard Ries, a 1929 graduate of Hedrick who received his Law Degree from Drake, was appointed Hearing Examiner for the Interstate Commerce Commission in Washington, D.C. It is within his line of duty to hear cases pertaining to railroad problems such as abandonment of branch lines and other railroad problems.


