... was less aggressive, although its decline was halted. Other specialties participating in the mild improvement included Great Atlantic and Pacific, New Jersey zinc and some low priced issues.

The more favorable nature of oil company earnings statements for the first quarter, combined with further evidence of firmness in gasoline prices and definite announcement of the Pan American-Standard Oil of New Jersey transaction, helped petroleum stocks.

Utilities, after a little early uncertainty, developed more confidence. Electric Bond and Share, Commonwealth Edison and American Gas were well supported.
