F.N.BUCKINGHAM LAI D T O R E S T THIS A F T E R N O O N

Prominent in Local and County Activities for Half a Century

F. N. Buckingham, prominent citizen and extensive land owner passed away at his home early Tuesday morning of this week, following an illness of about a weeks duration. Mr. Buckingham suffered a stroke about ten days ago. He apparently showed considerable improvement, but he suddenly took a change for the worse. Funereal services were held this Thursday afternoon from his home with Rev. T. Ernest Hoon in charge. Burial was made in Woodlawn cemetery.

The Buckingham's moved to a farm in Elk township 48 years ago, came from Somonauk, Illinois. Here they lived until about 12 years ago, when they moved to Alta. They developed one of the finest farms in this section. Mr. Buckingham always took an active part in the public affairs of the community and county, holding various township offices. In 1904 he was elected a Representative of Buena Vista County in the State Legislature, which he served for two terms. It was while serving in the lower house, Mr. Buckinham was named on the committee which framed the drainage law of the state, making it possible to transform many acres of swamp land in some of the most fertile fields of the state. It was this particular law, which Mr. Buckingham often referred to with much pride.

Frank N. Buckingham was born in DeKalb county, Illinois, on March 26, 1867. As a young man he was employed in the mercantile business for several years. On December 28, 1880 he was united in marriage to Miss Olive Philpott. For two years they lived on a farm near Somonauk, Ill. In 1882 they moved to Buena Vista county where they have since made their home. Besides his widow three children survive, A. W. and Jay of Alta and Mrs. Herbert Wall of Storm Lake. Also one sister, Mrs. W. A. Johnson of Princeton, Illinois.
