Death Writes "30" For Former Bee Editor

PAUL E. STILLMAN IS CALLED
Died Friday At Corona del Mar
Home; Burial Monday At
Forrest Lawn


Paul E. Stillman, 83, former editor and publisher of THE BEE and still a partner in the ownership of this newspaper at the time of his death, passed away at his home in Corona del Mar, Calif., last Friday morning. Funeral rites were conducted Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock from Klefer and Eyerick Mortuary in Glendale. Interment was at Forrest Lawn Memorial park.

The son of E. B. and Elizabeth Bowman Stillman, Paul E. Stillman was born in Chicago, Ill., November 4, 1888. He attended school in Chicago, then in Waucoma, Iowa, and attended high school at the Chicago Manual Training school.

Pioneer Family
 His father was an early-day newspaper pioneer in Iowa, coming to the state in 1856, first to Iowa City, then to Des Moines and to Sioux City. At Sioux City he established the Sioux City Journal in 1863, later returning to Chicago to operate a printing establishment. Following the great Chicago fire, the Stillmans returned to Iowa and to Waucoma.

It was in 1884 that the Stillmans first became associated with THE BEE. In that year E. B. Stillman purchased the newspaper and the family moved here from Waucoma. In 1887 Paul entered the University of Michigan from which he was graduated in 1891 with the degree of bachelor of arts.

He began his newspaper work



even in his college days as managing editor of the senior publication of the university.

On July 1, 1891, his father sold him a half-interest in THE BEE and he became active in its publication. In January, 1895, his father sold his remaining half interest to another son Frank and the two brothers shared the publishing duties for a number of years.

House Speaker
 In 1906 Paul was elected to the Iowa legislature as Greene county's representative and was reelected in 1908 and 1910. In his final term he served as speaker of the Iowa House, one of two Greene county men to have that honor in the history of the state. The other was Capt. Albert Head who served in 1886.

Following his return from the legislature Paul shared the editorial duties of THE BEE with Victor H. Lovejoy. During this period he was a pillar of strength in the com-

munity, making many outstanding contributions.

He was one of the founders of the Greene County Farm Bureau, was the first president of the Jefferson Rotary club and was a director and platform manager of the Jefferson Chautauqua for a number of years. In 1914 he was keynote speaker at the state Republican convention and was a delegate to the national convention in 1916. For eight years he was a member of the state board of education.

To Glendale In 1923
 In 1923 he and his family moved to Glendale, Calif., where he established the Stillman Printing Company in which he remained active until shortly before his death.

In Glendale his activities included the presidencies of the Rotary club, Chamber of Commerce, board of education and the Glendale Republican club and chairmanship of the Verdugo council of Boy Scouts and of the Community Chest campaign. He belonged to the Masonic orders including the Shrine. He held the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws from Rollins college at Winter Park, Fla., where he served as trustee since 1930.

His church membership continued to remain in the Jefferson Presbyterian church until the time of his death. He became a member on March 18, 1888, and had the second longest membership on the church roll.

Survivors
 His first wife was Edith May Anderson of Jefferson who died. He is survived by his wife, the former Anne Ruth Anderson; two daughters, Mrs. James VanScoy and Mrs. Carol Higley, both of Glendale; a son Paul B. Stillman of Glendale, and three grandchildren. His parents, brother Frank and an infant sister Lulu preceded him in death.

Phil Kearney, who was killed at Chantilly. That he was a Union soldier from 1861 to 1865, confronting the Confederacy and helping to destroy it, is his one boast in life. Practicing medicine in the early history of Greene county had certain strenuous features. It was not unlike campaigning. Like a certain notorious Roman of the days of the Republic, the country doctor had to be "patient of cold, of hunger and of waiting." On the whole medical work has its compensations, not the least of which is the breadth of the scientific field, so that if a man succeeds in coming out alive after nearly forty years of active practice, such an outcome may be considered a success.

PAUL EDWIN STILLMAN.

Paul E. Stillman, elected to represent Greene county in the Iowa general assembly in 1906, is well known as an active force in those movements which uphold the legal and political status of the country and which work for intellectual and moral advancement. He is now editor and manager of *The Bee* at Jefferson and one of the principal stockholders in this paper. The press has not only recorded the history of advancement, but has also ever been the leader in the work of progress and improvement—the vanguard of civilization—and Mr. Stillman has sought to make his journal such an expression of universal growth.


Mr. Stillman was born in Chicago, Illinois, November 4, 1868, and is the younger son of Edwin B. and Elizabeth L. (Bowman) Stillman. His father is one of the oldest representatives of journalism in Iowa and was selected for the authorship of the history of Greene county as the best known authority concerning its annals and its records. The son was educated in the common schools of Chicago and in the country school at Waucoma, Iowa, and received academic training in the Chicago Manual Training School. He thus prepared for

collegiate work at the State University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, in which he matriculated in the fall of 1887, and graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Arts in 1891. He began his newspaper work even in his college days, as managing editor of the senior publication of the university. His taste has always been along literary lines, and his initial step in the business world was made as his father's partner in the ownership and publication of the *Jefferson Bee*, which has the largest circulation of any county seat weekly newspaper in Iowa. He has been editor of *The Bee*, with full charge as manager, for ten years.

Mr. Stillman came to Jefferson from Chicago with his parents in 1884 and has resided here continuously since. He has been successful in business from the start, the patronage of the paper having grown steadily during the sixteen years of his connection therewith, both in its circulation and advertising departments. Mr. Stillman is also interested in Greene county farm land and city properties, and is the vice president of the *Jefferson Savings Bank*.

From his youth Mr. Stillman has been an interested student of the signs of the times and of the great problems which mark the trend of modern thought and action. He is a republican, believing in the reform principles of Roosevelt, but he never aspired to public office until 1906, when he was elected as representative from his district, as above noted. He is also interested in literary and musical societies and for three years has been a director of the *Jefferson Chautauqua Assembly*. His fraternal relations have since 1891 connected him with *Morning Star* lodge, No. 159, A. F. & A. M., of which he served as secretary for seven years. He belongs to the Presbyterian church of Jefferson and is a member of the board of church trustees.

Mr. Stillman was married February 28, 1894, to Edith May Anderson, a daughter of S. B. Anderson, one of the old settlers of the county. They have no children of their own, but in June, 1905, adopted an infant girl, whom they

have christened Faith Winifred Stillman. Mr. Stillman's strong characteristics include a stalwart defense of what he believes to be right and a firm expression of his opinions, without bitter aggressiveness. In fact, he is very considerate of the feelings of others, with a highly sensitized temperament, which is an almost invariable accompaniment of one who finds his pleasure in literary and aesthetic rather than in business lines.

J. W. THORNBURGH.

J. W. Thornburgh is the owner of a fine farm property comprising three hundred and eighty acres of rich land on section 24, Franklin township. He was born in this county, January 10, 1859, a son of Joel N. Thornburgh, who was a native of Tennessee, but in 1853 came to Iowa, settling in Greene county. He established his home in Hardin township, where he lived for some time, but his last days were spent at Woodward, Iowa. His wife bore the maiden name of Rebecca Ogle.

J. W. Thornburgh of this review attended the district schools in his boyhood days and therein mastered the common branches of English learning, becoming thus well qualified for life's practical duties. He worked upon the home farm in his youth, early becoming familiar with the best methods of tilling the soil and caring for the crops. Until twenty-two years of age he remained at home and then started out in life on his own account. As the years have gone by he has prospered and he is now the owner of three hundred and eighty acres of arable and productive land on section 24, Franklin township. The farm presents a very attractive appearance because of the care and labor which he bestows upon it and annually he harvests good crops as a reward for his industry and diligence.

In 1882 Mr. Thornburgh was united in marriage to Miss Mary Emma Lee, a resident of

Greene county, and unto them have been born four children: Clyde; William, deceased; Ethel, the wife of Wesley Ure, of Franklin township; and Wayne, yet at home. The parents are much esteemed in the community where they live, their many excellent traits of character gaining for them a large circle of warm friends.

Mr. Thornburgh exercises his right of franchise in support of the men and measures of democracy, but has never sought or desired political office for himself. He belongs to the Modern Woodmen camp at Jamaica, Iowa, and his wife holds membership in the United Brethren church. He has spent his entire life in Greene county and the fact that many of those who have known him from boyhood entertain for him warm and unqualified regard is an indication that his has been an honorable career.

EDWIN S. YOUNG.

Edwin S. Young was born in Tipton, Cedar county, Iowa, in 1853, being the son of Sheldon W. and Melinda W. (Greene) Young, both natives of Vermont and of Revolutionary stock, Mrs. Young having been a descendant of General Greene of the Colonial Army, while her husband's Grandfather Hillard also fought for independence. Sheldon W. Young was a well known merchant, a man of strong and upright character, qualities which he inherited from his Scotch ancestry. He came to Iowa in 1852, locating in Tipton, and entered a tract of land in Cedar county, later buying and selling extensive tracts in that locality. He was a member of the Masonic order and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. His political support was given to the whig party and afterward to the republican party, and he served as clerk of Cedar county and also as a member of the board of supervisors. He passed away in 1892 at the age of sixty-seven years, but his widow is still living in Jefferson at the age of seventy-nine.

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Paul E. Stillman, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Paul E. Stillman was born in Chicago, Illinois, November 4, 1868. He was the son of E. B. and Elizabeth Bowman Stillman. He attended school in Chicago, and then at Waucoma, Iowa, where his father engaged in the business of milling. He later attended high school at the Chicago Manual Training School.

He came with his parents to Iowa in 1856, and resided in Iowa City, Des Moines and Sioux City. His father established the Sioux City Journal in 1863. Following that, he returned to Chicago and operated a printing establishment until the great Chicago fire, after which the Stillmans returned to Iowa and to Waucoma.

In 1884 he became associated in the publication of The Jefferson Bee.

Mr. Stillman entered the University of Michigan in 1887, graduating in 1891 with a degree of Bachelor of Arts. He purchased an interest in The Jefferson Bee that year and became active in its publication with his brother, Frank.

He served three terms, from 1907 to 1911, in the House of Representatives, being Speaker of the House in the Thirty-fourth General Assembly. In 1914 he was temporary chairman of the Republican state con

vention, and in 1916 a delegate to the Republican national convention. He served eight years as a member of the Iowa State Board of Education, and removed to Glendale, California in 1923, and established the Stillman Printing Company, in which he remained active until a short time prior to his death.

Mr. Stillman married Edith May Anderson of Jefferson, in February, 1894, who died. His second wife, Anne Ruth Anderson survives him, also a son, Paul B. Stillman, and two daughters, Mrs. James Van Scoy and Mrs. Carol Higley of Glendale, and three grandchildren. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church, the Masonic bodies, I.O.O.F. and various civic organizations at both Jefferson and Glendale, and held an honorary degree of Doctor of Laws from Rollins College at Winter Park, Florida.

Mr. Stillman died at Carona del Mar, California, February 15, 1952.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Fifty-fifth General Assembly of Iowa, That in the passing of The Honorable Paul E. Stillman, the State has lost and honored citizen, and a faithful, useful public servant, and the House by this resolution would express its appreciation of his service, and tender its sympathy to the members of his family.

Adna M. Utterback was the son of Josiah and Frances Utterback, born April 9, 1860 near Sigourney, Iowa. He lived his entire life in Keokuk County moving to Hedrick, Iowa, in 1890. His first of many business enterprises in Hedrick was a lumber and implement business. In the middle 1940's Mr. Utterback sold his farm and livestock and became inactive in business.

Perhaps, his most outstanding enterprise, was the promotion of the kite race track just before the turn of the century. He was not the founder of the track but purchased an interest in the venture in 1892.






