Six Albia high school musicians have been accepted for membership in the all-southeastern Iowa high school band that will appear next Thursday at the Southeastern Iowa Teachers association convention in Burlington.

Albians among the 125 members of the band will be Ruth Watt, Oscar Hassman, Evelyn Bernstein, Mary Buzz Flynn, Violet Woodcock and Maxine McGinnis. All those who competed as soloists in the sub-district music contest were nominated for inclusion in the band.

In addition, Director Dale Caris has been asked to aid in preparation for the concert by directing a rehearsal of the brass group.

There were 300 applicants for places in the band and only 125 were accepted. The director will be Prof. Charles E. Richter of the University of Iowa music department.

The group will rehearse during the day and appear before the convention in the evening, playing a concert of six selections: the "Praise ye" trio from Attica; University of Chicago march; "The Vedette," quick march; "Come, Sweet Death," chord melody; "Daphnis," overture; "Sunday Morning at Ghon" from "By the Lake at Geneva."

## VETERAN ALBIA ATTORNEY DIES ON WEDNESDAY

### Thomas Hickenlooper, Active Republican, Succumbs to Illness

Thomas Hickenlooper, veteran Albia attorney, died at his home in Albia at 8:40 Wednesday night. He was 60 years old. He had been in ill health since the first of January, and since a stroke three weeks ago had been much worse, his condition becoming critical last week after a brief rally.

Funeral services will be held at the Church of Christ Friday afternoon at 2:30. The Rev. O. M. Morgan will preach the funeral sermon with the Rev. W. J. Hastie assisting. Pallbearers will be C. W. Smallwood, Fred Everett, J. C. Mabry, Albert Hollingshead, Chet Woodcock and Stanley Hoyne.

A prominent republican, he was always active as a campaign speaker. Hickenlooper served the county as clerk of the district court for six years, served two terms as state representative after being first elected in 1908, and served the city as mayor for part of a term, resigning before its completion.

Born near Foster, son of Mr. and Mrs. Theophilus Hickenlooper, he was principally active in the county as a probate attorney. After attending public school at Foster, high school in Albia, and the Ottumwa business college, he studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1900. He was a member of the Church of Christ, the Masonic and Modern Woodman lodges.

Hickenlooper died a week to the day following the death of his close friend, S. W. Wilson, Albia newspaperman. Both were members of the same Albia social club for many years.

Surviving are Mrs. Hickenlooper, the former Nora Floyd to whom he was married Oct. 3, 1901, two sons, Marlon of Albia, and Floyd of Washington, D. C. Floyd arrived in Albia Wednesday afternoon at 1 o'clock. A sister and brother also survive, Mrs. Mary Hays of Ness City, Kan., and Harry of Scott City, Kan.
