The Rev. George W. Swan, 73,

heart ailment Friday morning at
his home. He had been in poor
health since suffering a stroke
before coming to Des Moines four
years ago.

A retired Baptist minister, the
Rev. Mr. Swan formerly served
as pastor in Knoxville, Plano and
Chariton river. He retired from
active service when moving to
Des Moines.

The Rev. Mr. Swan was born
in Plano.

He is survived by his widow,
Cora; three daughters, Mrs. Jack
L. Morgan and Mrs. James R.
Seay of Des Moines and Mrs.

GEO. SWAN CALLED BY DEATH TODAY

Rev. George Swan, former resident of this city, passed away this morning at approximately 7:30 at his home on West 25th Street in Des Moines. Rev. Swan had been in ill health for four years, and suffered a stroke a few weeks ago.

He was born May 30, 1874, the son of George and Ann Swan, in Pennsylvania. He together with his parents, came to this county soon after. His parents lived in Plano. He was ordained as a Baptist minister at the age of 22.

In 1906, he was elected to the Iowa legislature, and served two terms. He is quite well known in Iowa, and especially Appanoose County.

Surviving are his wife, Cora Swan, three daughters, Mrs. Jack Morgan and Mrs. James R. Seay both of Des Moines and Mrs. R.W. Findlater of Los Angeles, Calif. one son, George, Jr., of Bedford, Iowa, a sister, Minnie E. Swan, and a brother, Frank Swan, both of Plano. A brother and sister preceded him in death.

The body is being returned to the Miller Funeral Home in this city for funeral services and burial. Arrangements are pending at this time, and will be announced later.


