### Death of George Tilton

Word was received here Sunday afternoon which announced the death of our former fellow citizen, George Tilton, which took place at his home near Des Moines that day. The remains arrived here Wednesday and were escorted to the U. B. church from which the funeral took place to the cemetery adjoining, the sad rites being conducted by Rev. Kisor, an old family pastor and life long friend.

We have been unable to secure data for an obituary, but the deceased is so well known in this community, and in Iowa county, which was his home for most of his life, that anything we might say would be superflous to his friends. Deceased was a man among men, and always took an active part in public affairs and stood for the best type of citizenship. He served his county well in the legislative halls of his state and was one of the men who gave character and force to enactments having for their object human uplift. We hope to give a more detailed obituary next week.

### Suddenly Stricken.

Mrs. Trueman was suddenly stricken last Friday caused by the bursting of a blood vessel in the abdominal cavity which resulted in a hemorrhage followed by immediate prostration. A specialist was hastily summoned from Iowa City. He pronounced her condition as quite critical and advised her immediate removal to a hospital. This was done, she making the journey to Iowa City in much better shape than the physicians hoped for. Late advices from the hospital say that she is in a very critical condition but that she is gaining slowly and there is hope for her final recovery.

George W. Tilton.

George W. Tilton was born in Dun-  
ganon, Noble Co., Ohio, June 19, 1855  
Died at his home at Wick, Iowa, May  
12, 1912. At the age of nine years he  
came with his parents who settled at  
Montezuma where they lived one year,  
then moving to the old Tilton home-  
stead in Dayton township, Iowa Co.,  
where he grew to manhood.

He then engaged in the grain busi-  
ness at Brooklyn. Later he and his  
eldest brother founded the firm of  
Tilton Bros. at Keswick. He then  
moved to the farm near the twin  
churches where he was a successful  
farmer and stock raiser. Two years  
ago he moved to Wick, Iowa, but it  
was his intention to come back to  
Iowa county to spend the last years  
of life, but sickness and death pre-  
vented the change.

He was married Jan. 29, 1880, to  
Miss Mary Leve, of Malvern, Ohio,  
and to this union were born four chil-  
dren: twin boys, who died in infancy,  
Logan, and Mrs. Jennie Wagner, who  
are with their mother mourning the  
loss of a loving father and husband.  
He also leaves three grandchildren,  
five brothers, four sisters, and a host  
of relatives and friends.

Mr. Tilton represented Iowa co. in  
the 33rd Assembly and faithfully per-  
formed the duties pertaining to his  
office. Besides his immediate family,  
his two brothers, E. L. and Grant  
Tilton of What Cheer were by his bed-  
side when the death summons came.  
All that loving care and medical aid  
could do were done, but they could  
not save him from the grim Messen-  
ger. He was afflicted with Bright's  
Disease and valvular heart trouble.  
His health has been gradually failing  
for the last few years, but his grit and  
determination would not let him give  
up till ten days before death came  
he was compelled to take to his bed.

At the request of the family Rev.  
Wm. Keyser, of Bridgewater, came  
and delivered the funeral sermon at  
the U. B. church Wednesday, May 15,  
1912. He spoke from the text, "I know  
that my Redeemer Liveth." Among  
his remarks he said George Tilton was  
a man in the truest sense of the word,  
and by the emotion shown and tears  
shed by the friends assembled it was  
plainly shown that he had spoken the  
truth when he said he was beloved by  
all that knew him. At his own re-  
quest he was laid beside his twin  
boys in the U. B. cemetery, there to  
await the great day when God, not  
man, shall be judge. He was a great  
believer in Universalism and often  
said he was not afraid to die.
















potentiary to Columbia 1907-1908 and to Chili 1909-1910, and was Chief of the Division of Latin-American affairs in the Department of State from 1910 until his death. He was the author of a work entitled *South American Republics*.

CHARLES N. GILMORE was born in Stafford Springs, Conn., October 31, 1835; he died at Des Moines, Iowa, April 5, 1912. He was one of the numerous men of his time with the genius of working in and through the operating department of a railroad and into and to the top of an organization of such a department. He began on the Bellefontaine line in Ohio, but soon was employed as fireman on the Illinois Central railroad and was promoted to engineer before the Civil war. During that period he was a passenger conductor on the Illinois Central and in charge of regular and special trains of troops, filling his position, which was sometimes more than that of mere management of train business, with distinction. He was yet in the service of the same road when the great Chicago fire occurred, and in addition to ordinary work was detailed to the charge of special trains of spectators from the interior of Illinois to the scene of disaster, and of the stricken refugees from the city to places of comfort. In 1874 he accepted the position of superintendent of the Fort Dodge & Des Moines line and continued as division superintendent after the road was leased by the Rock Island Railway Company. He was, so to speak, the tutor of many men now in management of lines and systems of railways, and by such men, as well as by less important persons in the railway field, was held in singular honor throughout his life.

GEORGE W. TILTON was born in Dungannon, Ohio, June 19, 1855; he died at Wick, Warren county, Iowa, May 12, 1912. He removed to Montezuma, Iowa, with his parents when he was nine years of age and soon afterward to Dayton township, Iowa county, where he grew to manhood. He continued his residence in Iowa the remainder of his life, being engaged in farming or mercantile pursuits. He was elected to represent Iowa county in 1908, serving in the House in the Thirty-third General Assembly.

SHERMAN RILEY MACY was born at Bloomfield, Iowa, August 31, 1865; he died at Des Moines, Iowa, July 7, 1911. Professor Macy was educated in the grade schools of Bloomfield and at the Southern Iowa Normal, from which he graduated in 1888. He took advanced work in pharmacy and chemistry at Northwestern University, receiving the degree of Ph. G., and later Ph. C. He at once accepted the deanship of the school of pharmacy at Highland Park College, which position he held until in 1903 he was appointed State chemist and during his service established a firm reputation as an expert. He in did special work at Northwestern while on leave of absence in 1895, taking the degree of D. Pharm. In 1895 he was made State chemist of Idaho, and during his service of one year drafted a pure




