Favors 90% Price Props

Washington —(AP)— The house agriculture committee Tuesday approved a bill to peg farm price supports at 90 percent of parity for cotton, wheat, corn, peanuts, rice and tobacco.

The bill fixes a floor under price supports on these basic commodities through 1955.

Present legislation permits a sliding scale under which supports for these crops can range between 75 and 90 percent of parity. The agriculture department has announced it will support 1952 crops at 90 percent.

* * *

As it goes to the house, the new bill also would require that through 1955 the parity price for these crops be the higher parity price computed under either the original parity formula or the modernized formula adopted 3 years ago.

The 90 percent price support would apply except where producers have disapproved marketing quotas.

Parity is the price for crops the government determines is fair to the farmer in relation to the things he buys.

Since 1950 farmers have been allowed parity prices for the basic crops computed on the old formula, which afforded higher prices. This legislation extends this permission another 2 years.

However, this actually would not affect rice and tobacco, which obtain higher parity prices under the new formula.

* * *

The senate agriculture committee has approved a bill postponing 2 years the switchover to the new parity formula exclusively. The senate bill does not, however, include the mandatory 90 percent support feature.

The house banking committee included a provision in its de-

mandatory 90 percent support of the 6 basic crops for 1953.

Samuel Sater, Danville, Dies

Danville — Samuel Harlan Sater, 81-year-old former state representative and long-time postmaster of Danville, died June 14 at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Enid Ross, at Takoma Park, Md., where he and Mrs. Sater had gone last November to spend the winter.

His 15-year tenure is the longest ever attained by any Danville postmaster.

Sater was a member of the Methodist church and the Masonic lodge. He was married to Maude Gaines at Danville on Dec. 16, 1895. She survives, as do 2 daughters: Mrs. Jeanne Moehn, Silver Springs, Md., and Mrs. Ross; 2 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren.

Three brothers and one sister died previously.

Last rites will be held at the Baptist church of Danville at 11 a. m. Wednesday. The Rev. Harold Olson will officiate, and burial will be in Jagger cemetery, with the Masonic ritual being performed at the graveside.

The body is at the Elliott chapel, in New London.

UN Walkout Interrupts Nam Tirade

Munsan, Korea —(AP)— United Nations truce negotiators walked out on the Communists again Tuesday as the senior red delegate was talking. They said they wouldn't be back for 3 days.

North Korean Gen. Nam Il's interpreter was saying "I have something more to say" when Maj. Gen. William K. Harrison declared:

"There being no further business to transact today we are now leaving and will return June 21. Our liaison officers are available for necessary meetings."

* * *

Brig. Gen. William P. Nuckols, UN spokesman, said that when Harrison walked out the reds broke out in "apparently rehearsed laughter which was supposed to have been derision, I imagine."

Harrison said "we hope they will think the matter over" and realize that the UN proposal for settling the truce blocking issue of prisoner exchange is final.

* * *

It was the second time in less than 2 weeks that Harrison had forced a 3-day recess on the reds in the hope they would reconsider their demand that all captured reds be repatriated. The UN says no prisoner will be forced to return. Only 70,000 of 169,000 allied POW's have expressed willingness to be repatriated.

Tuesday's walkout came at the end of a 32-minute meeting at which Nam delivered what Harrison called a "bitter and belligerent" propaganda assault on the allies.




