# School Board Elect Annual Red Cross Drive

## City Is at Third of Goal

### Need Remains for Support by All In Annual Drive Says Chairman.

Lucas county's Red Cross drive is off to one of the fastest starts in history, Noel W. Cloud, county chairman, announced today.

Work in Chariton started Tuesday morning and one-third of the city's quota had been reached by this morning. Chariton's quota was set at \$900. The county's quota is \$2100.

Virgil Meyer of Chariton is in charge of the city drive while the Farm Bureau women are conducting the drive in the townships. Judge C. F. Wennerstrum is in charge of the drive for the other towns in the county.

Cloud pointed out today that people in Iowa saw first hand the value in Red Cross disaster work during the floods and tornadoes last spring and that he anticipated that the quota would be met. "It requires a lot of time and effort however, and those who are doing the job deserve the real thanks of the community," he said today.

He called attention again today to the fact that a new project is now under way by the Red Cross. It is that of providing blood banks at all hospitals for the gratis use of those who need such medication.

"While this project is just started it illustrates the fact that the Red Cross stays up-to-date in recognizing the needs and takes steps to meet them. This project will ultimately make whole blood and blood derivatives ultimately available without cost for the products to the nation's entire population," Cloud stated.

A large portion of this year's funds will be earmarked for the exclusive use of the armed forces, particularly those troops on occupation duties and those in the naval service stationed outside the United States.

## C. W. Huntley, 81, Rites Are Wednesday

Clark W. Huntley, 81, veteran worker in farm organizations, died Monday at the Still College Osteopathic hospital in Des Moines. He had been a patient there for several weeks.

Services were held Wednesday at 2 p. m. at the Beardsley Funeral home.

Huntley had been in ill health for some time, following an attack of influenza and entered the hospital with a heart ailment. He was, at the time of his death, chairman of the Iowa soil conservation committee, had been a vice president of the Iowa Farm Bureau Federation and had also served Lucas county as state representative. He was the first Farm Bureau president in Lucas county and had long been identified with soils conservation work in the county as well as all over the state.

He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Mary Larson Chariton, and Mrs. Nancy Fuller, Des Moines, and one son, Mark Huntley, Guthrie Center.

The speaker gave an address at the Drake University convocation in Des Moines Wednesday night. He is a trustee of the University. His speech Friday will be his first local appearance since his return.


