HEART ATTACK FATAL TODAY; RITES MONDAY

Was In Iowa Legislature
Prior To World War;
Graduate Of S. U. I.
Law College

County Atty. Edward A. Baldwin, 52, 1708 East College street, lifelong resident of Johnson county, died suddenly of a heart attack at his home at 3 o'clock this morning. He had been county attorney of Johnson county since January 1, having been elected to office on the democratic ticket last November.

Mr. Baldwin served in the 37th general assembly of Iowa in 1917 and 1918 before joining service in the United States army. He was a second lieutenant in the forces.

He was elected as county attorney first in 1935 and served a two-year term.

S.U.I. Graduate

The son of John and Jane Baldwin, pioneer residents of Johnson county, he was born July 10, 1889, in Clear Creek township.

He graduated from the University of Iowa college of law in 1913 and taught school for a few years. He married Mabel Crain.

Mr. Baldwin was a member of the Roy L. Chopek post, American Legion, past exalted ruler of the local Elks lodge, past president of the Johnson County Bar association and a member of the degree staff of the Moose lodge.

Survivors

He is survived by his widow; two daughters, Joan, 14, and Mary Jane, 13, both at home; two brothers, Jay Baldwin of Tiffin and Arthur Baldwin of Iowa City, and five sisters, Mrs. Lida Corder of Kansas City, Mo., Mrs. Dave Ahern of Iowa City, Mrs. Mayme Dolmage of Buffalo Center, Mrs. Marguerite Hart of Vinton and Miss Jeanette Baldwin of Vinton.

His parents and two brothers preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be held at 9 o'clock Monday morning at St. Patrick's church with burial in St. Joseph's cemetery. The remains will be at home until time of the service.

Representative from Des Moines county, was born June 10, 1889. He received his preliminary education in the public schools and St. Cecelia academy at Burlington. Shortly after graduation from the academy he entered Elliott's business college, from which he graduated about two years later, then entered the law office of J. T. Illick at Burlington for the purpose of studying law. Was admitted to the bar in 1913 and has been engaged in the practice of law since that time. He is the first republican elected from Des Moines county for about twenty years. Holds memberships in the Malta lodge, A. F. & A. M., St. Omar Commandery Knights Templar, Washington lodge, I. O. O. F., and the Order of Red Men. Is a member of the Methodist Episcopal church of Burlington. Elected representative in 1916. A republican in politics.

JAMES W. BAILEY,

Representative from Shelby county, was born May 21, 1871, in Adams county, Illinois, of American parentage. In 1872 his parents moved to Des Moines, Iowa. In 1892 he located in Harlan, Shelby county, Iowa, where he now resides. On January 20, 1903, he was married to Miss Elizabeth McQuillen. Is a member of all the Masonic bodies at Harlan, and is also a member of the Iowa society of the sons of the American Revolution. Elected representative in 1914. Re-elected in 1916. A democrat in politics.

EDWIN A. BALDWIN,

Representative from Johnson county, was born July 10, 1889, on a farm in Johnson county. Attended public schools and the Iowa City academy. Taught in the public schools of Iowa and South Dakota. Spent four years in the State University of Iowa, one year in the College of Liberal Arts and three years in the College of Law, from which he was graduated in 1913. He has practiced his profession in Iowa City, Iowa, since his admission to the bar, as a member of the firm of Baldwin & Baldwin. Was elected representative in 1916. He is unmarried. A democrat in politics.

WILLIAM BECKER,

Representative from Clayton county, was born at Elkader in Clayton county, Iowa, March 18, 1874. Graduated from Rolfe high school June 17, 1892, from the Elkader High School in 1899, attended the University of Iowa, and became a registered pharmacist in 1891. Has been engaged in the drug business at Elkader, Iowa, continuously since 1892. Served as a member of the school board for ten years. Married Mollie Schmidt in 1899. Elected representative in 1914. Re-elected in 1916. A republican in politics.

HOWARD W. BENN,

Representative from Washington county, was born in Washington county, June 11, 1876. Attended the country schools until 1899. Was engaged in farming and live stock business until 1910. United in marriage in 1906 to Mary E. Nelson. To them was born one son. Served as county auditor from 1910 until 1914. Elected representative in 1916. Republican in politics.
