Frank A. Garber, 99, of Leon, who would have been 100 if he had lived until May 8, 1965, died Thanksgiving morning at the Frost nursing home in Leon where he had been living.

Mr. Garber, who had always lived in Decatur county, was a farmer and a minister of the Church of the Brethren. He had many friends in the county. He served two years as the Decatur county state representative.

\$360,000 L Mutual Tele

C. W. Chactain, general manager of the Grand River Mutual Telephone Corporation, Princeton, Mo., announced this week the approval by the REA of a loan of \$360,000 to finance the operation of the area in an around Barnard and Guilford, Mo.

Using company funds, with REA permission, the dial exchange for the area has been engineered, a central office building constructed and central office equipment contracted for. Bids for outside plant work were taken and rejected as too high early this fall. New bids will be taken in January, 1966. The Public Service Commission has also authorized Grand River Mutual Telephone Corporation to serve in and around Conception Junction and Clydesdale, Mo.

The loan just approved makes a total borrowing from REA by Grand River Mutual Telephone Corporation of \$9,369,000.

OBITUARY

Frank Angelo Garber was born May 8, 1865 near Leon. He was graduated from Leon High school, and taught in many of the schools of the county. After the death of his father, he and his mother farmed until he went in farming for himself on his farm north of Leon. In September, 1892, he married Susan Emma Wolfe, who died November 19, 1942. To this marriage nine children were born. Two of these children preceded him in death.

Mr. Garber was a representative in the Iowa Legislature for two years, from 1917 to 1919, and lobbyist for the Farmers' Union in 1921, 1923 and 1927.

He was an ordained elder in the Church of the Brethern, a member of the Franklin church.

Frank died Thursday, November 26, 1964, at the Frost Nursing Home in Leon at the age of 99 years, 6 months and 16 days.

He is survived by seven children: Mrs. Grace Cone, Portis, Kans.; Mrs. Esther Dible, Sheleota, Pa.; Mrs. Edith Gingerich, Longview, Tex.; Mrs. Alice Peer, Harrisburg, Pa.; Miss Angie Garber, Cuba, New Mexico; Elmer Garber, Akron, Ohio

and Samuel Garber, Nikerson, Kans. Also four sons-in-law and two daughters-in-law, 18 living grandchildren, (two preceded him in death), 33 great grandchildren, many nieces and nephews and a host of friends.


