


He was captured, according to his sister, Miss Gladys Malmsbury, as he sought to join American armed forces. Army records indicate he died May 14, 1942, at the age of 37. Cause of death is undetermined. In addition to his sister he leaves his mother, Mrs. Mamie Malmsbury. Both live at 14704 Victory Blvd., Van Nuys.
