

William Sutherland Dies Suddenly

SERVED COUNTY AS A LEGISLATOR

DEATH ATTRIBUTED TO HEART TROUBLE—FUNERAL THURSDAY

William Sutherland, 84 years old, for many years a prominent farmer and resident of Washington, died suddenly this morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Gertrude Doig, three and a half miles southwest of town.

He had been failing in health for the last year, suffering from a heart ailment, and the fatal attack came about 8:30 as he was splitting wood near the house.

Funeral Thursday

Funeral services will be held Thursday morning at 10:30 at Sherman's funeral home, followed by burial in Elm Grove cemetery.

Mr. Sutherland had long taken an active part in Washington affairs. He was a zealous member of the democratic party and was elected to the 38th general assembly, serving in 1919 as the representative from Washington county.

He was a member of the Methodist church and had been active in its affairs and faithful in his attendance. He was formerly prominent in the Washington County Farmers' Mutual Insurance association.

Native of Virginia

Mr. Sutherland was born at North Garden, Va., August 3, 1853, a son of Clifton and Mary Aminette Sutherland. He was reared in Virginia and when a young man went to Frankfort, West Virginia, where he was engaged by the mercantile business.

He came to Washington in April, 1874, and had lived in this community ever since, except for a year at Sigourney.

He was married Feb. 15, 1882, to Winnie E. Davis, who died March 10, 1925. He was again married in August of 1930 to Mrs. Jane Hahn of Sigourney, who died about a year later. Since then he had made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Doig.

Besides the daughter he leaves three grandchildren, four great grandchildren, one brother, Austin Sutherland of Washington and a sister, Miss Mattie Sutherland of Fairfield, Va.



Mr. Greiner helped furnish the food, which consisted of ice cream


and cake, ice cream cones, while candy bars and cigars were passed.




