OBITUARY

FRANK C. SAMPSON

Frank Cyrus Sampson, the son of Cyrus Henry and Martha Ellis Sampson, was born April 12, 1881 in Viola Township, Audubon County, Iowa and died October 11, 1981 at the Friendship Home in Audubon at the age of 100 years.

He grew up in Audubon County, graduated from Audubon High School, and attended Grinnell College and Iowa State College at Ames.

On April 22, 1908 he married May Layland in Audubon and 2 daughters were born to this union. They lived in Audubon and he managed farms and loved to work with horses. He served in the Iowa Legislature for 2 terms and a special session in the 1920's. May Layland Sampson died in March of 1929. In the 1930's he served as Mayor of Audubon. He was an active member of the First Presbyterian Church of Audubon, in many civic activities and a 50 year member of the Lions Club.

In January of 1949 he married May Hunt Farquhar. They lived in Audubon

until her death on February 15, 1971.

On July 22, 1972 he married Lucile Chaney at the Presbyterian Church in Audubon. They lived in Largo, Florida until August of 1979 when they became residents of the Friendship Home in Audubon. Lucile died on February 8, 1981.

Preceding him in death, in addition to his wives, were 1 grandson, Richard Hakes; his son-in-law, Kenneth Hakes; his parents; 1 brother, Henry Sampson; and 1 sister, Cora Emerson.

Survivors include his 2 daughters and son-in-law: Mary Louise Hakes and Jane and Charles Gooch, all of Phoenix, Ariz.; 4 grandchildren, and 7 great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. Andrew J. Hofer at the First Presbyterian Church in Audubon on Wednesday, Oct. 14, 1981 at 10:00 a.m. Interment was in the Arlington Heights Cemetery. Casket bearers were: Russell Bamsey, Timothy Davis, Charles Gooch, III, Russell Lange, Joseph Lunders, and Merle Petersen.


