Alanson K. Westervelt, 90, 103 Campus Ave., died Nov. 12 at Mary Greeley Hospital.

Services are Friday at 10:30 a.m. from Stevens Memorial Chapel with the Rev. Kenneth J. Huyck of the First Baptist Church officiating. Burial is at 2 p.m. in the Highland Cemetery near Churdan.

Born July 7, 1884 in Churdan, he attended Brown University, Providence, R.I. He came to Ames in 1939 from Webster City where he had been the City Clerk for eight years. He was employed by the First National Bank and in 1950 opened a grocery

store at Hyland Ave. and Lincolnway. Mr. Westervelt also served two terms in the Iowa Legislature. Upon retirement he ran the family farm near Grand River Junction.

Surviving are his wife, Clara; two sons, Robert A., Old Lyme, Conn. and James W. Hampton, Va.; two daughters, Mrs. Hazel Lee Orton, 616 Lynn Ave and Mrs. Miriam Rise Keller, Des Moines; a sister, Mrs. Belle Greene, Waterman, Ill. and two brothers, Mylo of Webster City and Ralph of Lakeland, Fla.

WESTERVELT, M.B.

M.B. Westervelt came to Greene County in 1880 and purchased 640 acres in Bristol and Highland Township from his maternal grandfather, Titus Knox. He later disposed of half of the land and developed the remainder into one of the finest farms in the area. He became known as a foremost breeder of Shorthorn cattle. He purchased a farm at the edge of Churdan and moved there with his family in 1900.

In 1902 he became connected with the Farmers and Merchants Bank, which in that year was purchased by Mahlon Head from Pentz and Bates. M.B. became cashier and had charge of the bank until his death in 1912.

FARMERS AND MERCHANTS BANK

The closing of the Farmers and Merchants Bank left a deep scar on Churdan and the community.

The bank was founded in the early years of the town by E.M. Pentz and was later taken over by E.S. Gose and W.L. Bates. In 1901 Mr. Gose and Mr. Bates started masonry work on the foundation for an addition to the Watts House, located on the

southeast corner of the Sand-Hill Street intersection, preparatory to moving their bank from their north side location. In March, 1903, the bank was purchased by M.M. Head of Jefferson and M.B. Westervelt, who had been farming southeast of Churdan for some time; then, in 1901, purchasing the Hill farm at the northeast corner of Churdan. Officers for the new bank were M.M. Head, president; Roscoe Head, vice president; M.B. Westervelt, cashier and local manager.

The new owners had scarcely become established in the business when the bank was destroyed in the fire of September, 1903. Their new bank, on the same location, was completed in 1904.

Soon after graduating from high school in 1904, M.B. Westervelt's son, Bernard, entered the bank as a teller. Later another son, A.K. Westervelt, joined the bank. After the death of their father in 1912, Bernard succeeded him as cashier and A.K. became assistant cashier.

The bank enjoyed a profitable business for many years until the early 1920s when hard times and low prices caused a heavy withdrawal of deposits and eventually forced the parent bank, The First National Bank of Jefferson, to close its doors. Over extension of loans and the inability of customers to meet their obligations resulted in too much frozen paper. As the news that this bank was in trouble leaked out, more and more people closed out their accounts and banked elsewhere. In a desperate effort to save their business, the bank owners drew heavily on the investment they held in three other banks, the Greene County Savings Bank of Jefferson, the Private Bank of Cooper, and the private Farmers and Merchants Bank of Churdan.

When the closing came in December, 1925, all four naturally had to close for their assets had been milked dry.

The depositors in the Farmers and Merchants Bank had such confidence in Bernard and A.K. Westervelt that 140 of them signed a petition asking that the District Court appoint Bernard as receiver for the closed bank, a request which was granted.

After the liquidation of the business was completed, the Westervelt families moved to Webster City. Churdan was the loser; one bank and two very fine families gone from its midst.

THE FIRST STATE BANK

The First State Bank of Churdan was established in 1889 by C.J. Martin and Associates, and was known as the Citizens Bank, which was located in a frame building on the south side of Main Street where the post office is now located. That building burned in the early 1900s and was replaced by a brick structure, where the bank remained until 1917, when the present bank building was built.

In 1902 C.J. Martin built, as a branch bank, the Farmers Bank of Adaza, to help the farmers in transacting their business. L.C. Corey was cashier of the bank and after his death the branch bank was closed.

In 1903 Mr. Martin sold stock to local citizens and took out a national charter. The bank was then known as the First National Bank of Churdan.

adjoining counties, which business he has followed to a greater extent than any man now residing in the county. In all of his business affairs he has prospered and the success which has come to him is well merited, for he has been honorable and straightforward at all times and has thus gained the admiration and respect of his fellowmen.

In 1881 Mr. Chapin was joined in wedlock to Miss Rachel Patterson, of Greene county, Iowa, and they have become the parents of three children, Willie C., who died in infancy; Laura and Nellie, at home. In his political views Mr. Chapin has always been a staunch republican and has served as township trustee, having also acted at various times in other minor offices. His family are members of the Methodist Episcopal church and are widely and favorably known in the community where they have now long resided. He possesses untiring energy, is quick of perception, forms his plans readily and is determined in their execution, and his close application to business and his excellent management have brought to him the high degree of prosperity which is today his. He has been connected with the farming interests of Greene county from pioneer times to the present, aiding in the arduous toil which was necessary in order to transform this region from a wild, uncultivated condition into a district which bears all the evidences of an advanced civilization.

MILO B. WESTERVELT.

Milo B. Westervelt, a prominent banker of Greene county, was born in Westerville, Franklin county, Ohio, December 8, 1856, which town was named in honor of the grandfather, William, and his brother, Peter Westervelt, who at an early day took up their abode there, cleared the heavily timbered land and made it their home. The parents of our subject were James and Catherine (Knox) Westervelt, the former also a native of Westerville, Ohio, where he was born May 20, 1825. He was a

millor and farmer by trade and lived in the place of his nativity until his demise, which occurred in 1892. In his family were three children, as follows: Milo B., of this review; Laura B.; and Josephine B.

Milo B. Westervelt acquired his education in the schools of his native town and remained there until he had reached the age of twenty-four years. In 1880 he came to Greene county, Iowa, and purchased six hundred and forty acres of land on sections 2 and 3, Bristol township, and on sections 29 and 30, Highland township, from his grandfather, Titus Knox. He afterward disposed of half of this but still owns the remaining three hundred and twenty acres, in Bristol township, which he has brought under a high state of cultivation and improvement. He has erected excellent buildings, has tiled the land and in fact has left nothing undone that would enhance the attractiveness of his place, thus making it one of the model farm properties of the county. In addition to his agricultural interests he is also engaged in raising shorthorn cattle and is an extensive feeder, having at the present time fifteen hundred head of sheep on his farm in Dakota. In 1902, Mr. Westervelt became connected with the Farmers & Merchants Bank, of Churdan, which in that year was purchased by the present owners. The institution is now known as Head, Westervelt & Company, real estate and banking, and is a private bank, with unlimited liability. It was established ten years ago by E. M. Pentz, and the officers at its head are: M. M. Head, president; M. B. Westervelt, cashier; and Mahlon Head, vice president. Mr. Westervelt, in connection with his son, Bernard, has entire charge of the bank, which is one of the strongest financial institutions in the county. He is a man of keen discrimination and sound judgment, and his executive ability and excellent management have brought to the concern with which he is connected a large degree of success. The safe conservative policy which he inaugurated commends itself to the

judgment of all and has gained the bank its wide reputation for reliability and sound financial standing.

On the 12th of September, 1883, Mr. Westervelt was united in marriage to Miss Rosa Diemer, a native of Wayne county, Iowa. Six children have graced this union, as follows: Alanson, now a student in Brown University; Bernard; Belle, who is at home; Hazel, attending school at Cedar Falls; Kate and Ralph, at home.

In his political affiliations Mr. Westervelt is a republican and his religious views are indicated by his membership in the Baptist church—a connection which shows him to be a man of high, manly principles and genuine personal worth. He is recognized throughout the county as one of its leading business men and upright citizens, having gained prominence and influence by reason of his honorable and straightforward business methods and in all his dealings with his fellowmen. He is public-spirited to a marked degree, giving his co-operation to every movement which tends to promote the moral, intellectual and material welfare of the community; and it is with pleasure that we present the record of his career to our readers.

GEORGE F. RIDER.

The home farm of George F. Rider is an excellent property on section 29, Paton township, and comprises one hundred and sixty acres, which he has brought under a high state of cultivation. He has always carried on farming save for a brief period in his early manhood, when his attention was given to the profession of teaching.

Mr. Rider is a native of Muscatine county, Iowa, born on the 9th of November, 1853. His father, John E. Rider, was born in Pennsylvania, May 13, 1813, and was reared in that state. In 1851 he became a resident of Muscatine county, Iowa, and two and a half years

later he took up his abode in Cedar county, this state, where he lived for eleven years, removing thence to Linn county in 1865. Eleven years were also there passed and in 1876 he came to Greene county, settling on the farm which is now the home of his son George and which came into his possession as an unimproved tract of land of one hundred and sixty acres. He made all of the improvements upon it and transformed the raw prairie into richly cultivated fields that responded readily to his care and labor in the production of golden harvests. He carried on farm work until the time of his death, which occurred September 2, 1886. Both he and his wife were members of the United Brethren church. Mrs. Rider bore the maiden name of Lydia Wertz and was born in Pennsylvania, June 13, 1818. There the days of her girlhood were passed and in June, 1840, she gave her hand in marriage of John E. Rider in the Keystone state. After living for eleven years in Pennsylvania they came to Iowa, as before stated. Mrs. Rider survived her husband for about fourteen years, passing away on the 5th of December, 1900, upon the old home farm on section 29, Paton township. They were both highly esteemed people, enjoying the good will and confidence of all with whom they were associated through business or social relations. Their family numbered seven children: William S., who died at the age of one year; Lucy A., who died when fifteen years of age; David O., who enlisted for service as a member of Company K, Eighth Iowa Cavalry, at the age of eighteen years, but died at Davenport, Iowa, before being sworn into the United States service; Martin M., who wedded Mary E. Karr, and lived in Linn county, Iowa, and died at the age of twenty-seven years, his wife having also passed away; George F., of this review; John F., who died at the age of five years; and Sarah E., the wife of William T. Swearingen, of Pueblo, Colorado.

George F. Rider spent the days of his boyhood and youth on the farms in Cedar and


