Died March the 1st, 1868, Mr. FAY
 WILSON, of this county, aged 74 years.

The subject of this sketch has been a
 resident of Iowa for many years—was born
 in Ky., where he run away, in his boyhood,
 from persecuting aunts, with nine pence in his
 pocket and a tow coat on his back, to Orange
 county, Indiana, where he hired out to work
 at ten pence per day, and, where he married
 into a highly respectable family, (Holliday
 by name) by whom he had nine children,
 seven of them now living. He represented
 his county, in Ind., in the legislature two
 terms. Moved to Iowa in 1836. In 1838 run
 for the legislature and was beaten by Wallace
 and A. B. Porter. In 1840 he was elected to
 the legislature, serving in that capacity up to
 1854. He was a Whlg, and was often twitted
 by his opponents with being a Quaker—he
 always attended that church. During his last
 illness he expressed a willingness to depart,
 knowing that his feet rested on the rock of
 Ages. He was always the friend of the poor
 man. His faculties remained unimpaired to
 the last. He has gone—not lost—but gone to
 enjoy a blissful eternity.

In the full recognition of the Existence, the Wisdom and Goodness of the Supreme Ruler of the Universe, the Township of Salem in the County of Henry in the State of Iowa, being in the full possession and use of my Mind and Understanding but deeply Sensible of the Uncertain duration of life and the inevitable Certain View that my Temporal Affairs May be put in readiness for that Event, so Make, Establish, Publish and Execute my Last Will and Testament—hereby revoking, annulling and setting aside all Prior or former Will or Wills Made

That is to Say

First

It is my full request wish and desire that all My just debts owing by Me at the time of my Death & burial Expenses be fully and justly paid as soon as the condition of my estate will possibly admit

Second

I Will and bequeath to my daughter Gulielina three hundred dollars and the George Miller Cow, to share and share alike with my other children in the division of my estate.

Thirdly

I will and bequest to Thomas Snook five hundred dollars in addition to what I have given him he

Fourthly

I will and bequeath to my grandson Paton Wilson (son of William Wilson) two hundred dollars & worth thirty dollars.

I will and bequeath to my daughter Gulielina, Thomas Snook and my grandson Paton Wilson joi farm for twelve months from and after the first day of March next.

I will and bequeath to my daughter Gulielina and my grandson Paton Wilson the necessary provi months from the first day of November last.

I will and bequeath to my grandson Paton Wilson (Son of Samuel Wilson) a Silver watch worth

I will and desire that after my demise all of my personal property may be sold in the way that my think most advisable.

Ninth

I will and desire that after the 1st day of March A.D. 1869 my Executor to proceed to sell all of n all together or in lots as he may think most advisable and make deeds to the same as valid as the them myself.

Tenth

I will and desire that all my children may be made equal in the benefit that I have given them wh determined by a book that I have kept relative thereto and then that they shall all share and share remainder of my Estate.

Eleventh

I further will and bequeath that in the event of consummation of a contract or an agreement that I Guardian of the heirs of Mary Wilson deceased relative to some Real Estate formerly held by sai and in that case I will and bequeath to Eliza McGilly wife of John McGilly of the County of Was of Iowa One hundred and fifty dollars.

I order and direct that the disposition of My property be cheerfully acquiesced in by all of the se this my will and I order and command and direct that should anyone named herein or any claimi seek litigation with the view of changing such distribution that from that time any interest he ma will cease and the acquiescing ???.

Finally I do hereby make constitute and appoint my beloved friend Peter Hobson Executor of my testament and having full confidence in his integrity and judgment I hereby Expressly waive his execution of the trust hereby imposed upon him and I hereby authorize him in disposing of my R same either at public or private auction as he may think most advisable and further authorize and out all of contracts and engagements as fully as I could do if living.




