

Zachary T. Doan Funeral Is Held

The funeral services of the late Mr. Zachary T. Doan were held Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 p. m. at the Friends church of Salem, Iowa, with burial in the Salem cemetery.

Rev. I. Cedric Peterson, pastor of the Mt. Pleasant Baptist church officiated, bringing words of comfort to the bereaved family. Mrs. Rachel Wormhout and Rev. Peterson sang two duet numbers, "Abide With Me" and "Lights of Home".

Zachary Taylor Doan, son of Malon and Alice Doan, and fifth child of a family of six (they having all preceded him in death), was born January 30, 1850, and passed away at his home April 12, 1936. He was 86 years, 2 months and 11 days of age.

Mr. Doan grew into manhood at his parental home, attending the public school of the community and worked on the farm, which became his life-long.

On December 2, 1883, he was united in marriage with Mary Agnes McDowell of the same community. To this happy union was added six children—four girls and two boys.

Mr. and Mrs. Doan located on a farm 3 miles northeast of Salem following their marriage. On this place they spent their entire wedded life, sharing life's joys and sorrows together.

Nels Peterson of Olds Dies

Nels Peterson, 78, prominent farmer of north Henry county for many years, died at Memorial hospital Wednesday morning at 10:30, after an illness of about two weeks.

Mr. Peterson was brought to the hospital last week critically ill from an affliction of the liver and became worse rapidly.

He had been active in public affairs during his life. He served as state representative for two terms in the early 1920's. At the time of his death he was a member of the county committee for appraisal for inheritance taxes. He had served in numerous capacities in the local community in which he resided.

He is survived by the widow, three daughters, Mrs. E. B. Lynch of Sigourney, Mrs. Roger Sherman of Washington and Ruth Peterson of Waterloo, a son, Wayne L. Peterson of Olds, and a sister, Mrs. Emma Swanson of Houghton, S. Dak.
