Relatives Seek Josef Dimebier

Word was received Thursday by County Clerk C. A. Norland that relatives are seeking a Josef Dimebier, whose last known address was Marshalltown.

Dimebier is being sought because his brother is very ill and wishes to hear from him. An inquiry requesting knowledge of Dimebier's whereabouts was sent to Norland from Louise Gross, 2635 Lakewood Ave., Chicago 14, Ill.

Anyone who knows Dimebier, his family or his whereabouts is asked to contact Norland at his office immediately.

Dimebier was born in Wegstadt bie Zebus, Bohemia, and came to America with his 11-year-old son in 1914 from Uhyhanken bie Tepnitz-Schonau, Bohemia. He sent for his wife and three children four years later.

In her letter, Mrs. Gross said Dimebier should have a family of 11. His "only known address is Marshalltown, Iowa," she wrote. First word that Dimebier was being sought by his brother, who lives in Germany, came from a Mrs. Rosa Gralms who wrote to Mrs. Gross. Ray P. Scott, Former Judge, Dies At 70

Services for Ray P. Scott, 70, 603 Fremont St., widely known attorney throughout Marshall County who died at Evangelical Hospital Wednesday evening after an illness of nearly two years, will be at 2:30 p. m. Saturday at the Pursel-Davis Funeral Home. The Rev. Orval E. Walker will be in charge. Burial will be in Riverside Cemetery.

MR. SCOTT, a Marshalltown resident since 1899, was born in North Eaton, Ohio, June 8, 1884, the son of the Rev. William H. and Laura E. Scott. He was graduated from Marshalltown High School in 1902 and Drake University in 1909.

He was the Marshall County Attorney from 1919-20; a member of the Iowa House of Representatives from 1920-24; a member of the Iowa State Senate in the 39th and 40th sessions; he was in the 1922 primaries for United States Congress, and was municipal and juvenile judge of Marshall County from 1942-49.

He was married to Kate Timmons in Marietta, Dec. 26, 1922. He was a member of Marshall Lodge No. 108 AF & AM, signet Chapter No. 38 R.A.M., King Solomon Council No. 20, St. Aldemar Commandery No. 40, Central Chapter No. 67 OES. He was a member of the Consistory in Cedar Rapids and the ZaGaZig Shrine in Des Moines and Madon Shrine No. 38 White Shrine of Jerusalem.

MR. SCOTT was a member of Central Christian Church of Christ, he was president of the Iowa Christian Missionary Society from 1931-49 and was a member of the Marshalltown Chapter of Izaak Walton League.

Survivors include the widow, a brother, Winfield W. Scott and a sister, Miss Iola G. Scott, both of Des Moines, Davis Funeral Home until Saturday morning.





MR. PRESIDENT: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life and public service of the late Honorable W. R. Ritchie, submits the following report:

William R. Ritchie was born at Port Andrew, Richland County, Wisconsin, July 8, 1867, of Scotch-Irish parents, and died in Storm Lake, Iowa, on March 8, 1954. In 1884 he came to Alta, Iowa, and in the spring of 1894 bought his first farm and began farming for himself. On February 26, 1896, he was united in marriage to Anna Jackson of Sac County, Iowa. To this union were born four children, Florence V. Robert C., Wendell R., and Donald S. He was a widely known, successful auctioneer of northwest Iowa. He was past master of Universal Lodge, 587, A.F. and A.M.

Mr. Ritchie served the Fiftieth district, comprised of Humboldt, Pocahontas, and Buena Vista Counties in the Iowa Senate during the Forty-fourth, Forty-fifth and Forty-fifth Extra sessions.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Fifty-sixth General Assembly: That in the passing of the Honorable Ritchie, the state has lost one who has always been very active in public affairs and kept interested and well informed on political matters, and the Senate tenders by this resolution its sincere sympathy to the surviving members of his family in their sorrow.

Wilbur Nielsen Skourup, 61, former Des Moines County State Senator, died of a heart attack at his White Acres farm near Spring Grove on Wednesday, at 3:45 p.m., February 10, 1954.

He had suffered from a heart condition for about three years. During 1950 he had been hospitalized for about a month but had continued active since. He had become ill at a recent Rotary Club meeting and was
