**John M. Slosson Dies Saturday  
Funeral Services Wednesday**

John M. Slosson, 86, former senator and representative in the Iowa state legislature, died in his home at 7:50 p.m. Saturday. Complications of advanced age contributed to his death.

A son of the late John and Jennie Slosson, he was born Oct. 27, 1876, on a farm near Northwood. He was a graduate of the Northwood high school and the Nora Springs Seminary at Nora Springs. He had served as Worth County Recorder and was in the real estate and loan business here from 1912 to 1926. He was in the employ of the Iowa State Banking department from 1926 to 1936, liquidating closed banks and was active in Republican politics. A member of the Iowa House of Representatives from 1917 to 1921 and was also a member of the Iowa State Senate through the Thirty-seventh to Fortieth General assemblies. He was elected mayor of

Northwood in 1947, taking an active part in community affairs, he was a member of the Commercial club and the Northwood Golf club.

In 1899 he married Sophia Savre who survives him. They were the parents of a daughter, Norma, who preceded him in death.

He was also preceded in death by three brothers, Charles, Frank and Roy and one sister, Mrs. George (Mary) Stelson.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 11 a.m. at the First Lutheran church. The Rev. H. A. Wilke officiated and burial was in the Sunset Rest Cemetery. Pallbearers included D. C. Wright, L. E. Plummer, Glenn O. Tenold, Richard H. Johnson, Clarence Huus and Wilford Huso.

Recorder John M. Slosson was born on a farm near Northwood on the 27th day of October 1876. He attended the High school in Northwood and later took a course in in Nora Springs Seminary.

In the summer of 1904 he concluded to make a canvass for the republican nomination to the office of county recorder. Though there was a large field of contestants he was chosen by a safe margin and duly elected. In 1906 he was re-elected without opposition, having proved himself a capable and obliging official.

Mr. Slosson is a son of the Hon. J. M. Slosson who so ably represented this district in the Iowa General Assembly. He possesses the unique distinction of being one of two Worth county office holders whose father's before them had also held office by gift of the Worth county voters. He owns a fine farm three miles south of Northwood in the equipment and maintenance of which he takes a keen interest.

On June 1, 1899 he was married to Miss Sophie Savre, daughter of E. E. Savre of this city.

### DEPUTY SHERIFF JAMES BARKER

Deputy Sheriff James Barker was born in Autwerp, Ohio, on Dec. 18, 1864. In July 1883 he came to Manly, Iowa, where he remained for three years. The next two

years were spent in Kensett and the following year in Northwood. In Sept. 1889 when the great boom in Duluth was on he migrated thither where he remained until 1892. He then returned to his native state of Ohio where three years were spent. In 1895 he returned to Northwood which has since been his home.

Nine years ago he was chosen sexton of Sunset Rest Cemetery, a position which he still holds. To his painstaking care in great measure is due the charming appearance of that beautiful resting place of the dead. Three years ago Sheriff Lee appointed Mr. Barker to the position of deputy sheriff of Worth county, an office which he has administered to the complete satisfaction of all law-abiding citizens.

For the past seven years he has been operating a poultry market in Northwood, having distributed many thousands of dollars among the farmers of this community.

Mr. Barker was married in Northwood on the 28th day of November, 1888 to Miss Ida M. Eighelberger. They have three daughters, Ethel M., Edith M. and Pearl M.

### SUPERVISOR N. E. KNUDSON

Supervisor N. E. Knudson was born in Norway Oct. 11, 1849. When he was but two years of age his parents emigrated to America. The family settled in Madison, Wis., where they remained for two years. Continuing their journey westward. They reached Mitchell county, Iowa, where the subject of this sketch grew to manhood.

July 27th, 1877, he removed to Manly and opened a restaurant. Three years later he disposed of this business and entered the dry goods business which he followed with unvarying success for six or seven years. After disposing of his mercantile interests he purchased a fine farm near Manly which he still owns.

Mr. Knudson was married on the 27th day of March 1875 to Miss Ellen Iverson, a native of Wisconsin. To

in Raymond, South Dakota; and Maude, the wife of Samuel Jacobs, whose home is Spring Valley, Minnesota.

Captain Gardner proudly wears the little bronze button that proclaims him a member of the Grand Army of the Republic and has been most prominent in the local organization to which he belongs, serving for five terms as post commander and for twenty years as adjutant of the post. He was chief mustering officer of the encampment at Detroit, Michigan. His interest in military circles never abating, he became identified with the National Guard, in which he remained active for a number of years. He served with the rank of first lieutenant in Company B and later in Company K of the Sixth Regiment of the Iowa National Guard for three years and was captain of the latter company for ten years. He has likewise figured prominently in public office outside of military connection and undoubtedly still higher political honors would have been given him had he cared to accept them. He served as court reporter of the twelfth judicial district in 1872 and 1873. He filled the office of member of the city council for three years, was on the school board for three years and for eight years or more occupied the position of justice of the peace.

#### JOHN M. SLOSSON.

John M. Slosson, an active factor in the business circles of Northwood, is junior partner in the firm of Emery & Slosson, real estate dealers, who specialize in handling Iowa lands. Since entering upon his active business career he has made substantial progress through the wise utilization of his time, talents and opportunities. He was born on the old Slosson farm about four miles south of Northwood, October 27, 1876, a son of John M. and Jennie R. (Finch) Slosson. The father was born in Broome county, New York, where also occurred the birth of the mother, and in that district they were reared and married. Mr. Slosson followed the occupation of farming and in 1856 removed westward, settling in Fillmore county, Minnesota, whence in 1857 he removed to Northwood, Worth county, Iowa. He purchased a farm just north of the city and operated it for a number of years but subsequently sold that property and removed to Kensett township, where he invested in land which he cultivated until his death, which occurred in 1900, when he was sixty-five years of age. His widow still survives

and now makes her home at Monrovia, California, at the age of seventy-seven years.

John M. Slosson spent his boyhood days in Kensett township and is indebted to the public school system for the educational privileges which he enjoyed. After attending the district schools he continued his studies in the high school at Northwood and still later was a student in the Nora Springs Seminary. Upon returning home he took up farm work in Kensett township, where he remained for a number of years, and in 1904 he was elected county recorder of Worth county, in which position he served for six years. He afterward made a business trip to California, returning to Iowa in 1910, at which time he embarked in the real estate business, concentrating his attention upon the handling of Iowa farm land. He has since remained active in this field of labor and is recognized as one of the leading business men of Northwood. He is alert and energetic, ready to meet any emergency with the confidence that comes from a right conception of things and an habitual regard for what is best in the exercise of human activities.

In 1899 Mr. Slosson was united in marriage to Miss Sophia Savre, a daughter of E. E. and Julia (Tenold) Savre and a native of Northwood. Her father was born in Dane county, Wisconsin, and was well known as a leading farmer of his community. He was sheriff of Worth county for several terms. Mr. and Mrs. Slosson have one child, Norma.

Since age conferred upon him the right of franchise Mr. Slosson has been a stalwart republican and he was elected to the thirty-seventh general assembly from Worth county in the year 1916, so that he is still a member of the Iowa house of representatives. He was president of the agricultural society for several years and he is interested in all plans and measures that have to do with the public welfare and general improvement. He has been a stalwart champion of the good roads' movement and his labors have been farreaching and effective in behalf of many plans for the public good. For sixty years the family name has figured in connection with general upbuilding in northern Iowa and the work begun by his father has been carried on by John M. Slosson, who is most loyal in his support of everything that has to do with furthering the interests and promoting the upbuilding of his section of the state.

#### J. F. RHODES.

The town of Fertile finds in J. F. Moreover, he is entitled to mention in this volume as the first white child born in Fertile township, being a representative of one of its oldest and best known families. The father was born in the province of Ontario, Canada, on the 2d of December, 1833, while the mother was a native of Jackson county, Iowa, born November 11, 1830. The Rhodes family in America is descended from Thomas Rhodes, who, with two brothers, emigrated from Yorkshire, England, to the United States between 1720 and 1725, settling in Rhode Island. Clyde H. Topping was born in Nees County, Kansas on January 8, 1884, son of John W. and Ida Johnston Topping, one of five children.

Mr. Topping attended the State University of Iowa, and later married Helen Young in Burlington on May 21, 1908. As a young man Mr. Topping farmed in Saskatchewan, Canada, later becoming a colonization agent for the Canadian Pacific Railway. In 1928 he entered Iowa politics and served in the Forty-second and Forty-third General Assemblies. Subsequently he was associated with Home Owners Loan, and later with the Iowa State Tax Commission. In recent years he had operated the Topping business.


