42 years, 7 months and 15 days.


On June 22nd 1922 she was
married to Dale J. Fritcher, liv-
ing on their home farm in Chick-
asaw Township until illness forced
her to enter the Hospital in July.

To this union was born one son,
Daniel Dale, who with the husband
and parents and grandfather are
left to mourn her passing.

At an early age she united with
the church, and through the years
has kept her faith with God—de-
ceiving strength to bear her trials
and suffering.

In the twelve months and more,
since her serious condition of
health became known, she has
been possessed of a fortitude and
a vitality of spirit that will long
be cherished in the memory of her
dear ones and a large number of
sympathizing friends. In one of
her last conversations she said
"It's no use for anyone to say there
is nothing in prayer and faith."
Then she spoke again of her an-
swered prayer for strength and
courage to meet the trials of each
day. We are reminded of the tree
in Ostergaard's poem, "That high
it reaches as deep it grows; and

Mr. Smith was elected as state
representative from Chickasaw
county on the Republican ticket in



1922 and again in 1924. The above
picture was taken at that time.

He also served as a member of
the board of supervisors of Chicka-
saw county from 1915 to 1921,
and for several years was presi-
dent of the Nashua State Bank.

His religious faith was indica-
ted by his membership in the
Congregational church.

On January 25, 1922, he was
married to Luna Bartsch, who
died in 1939.

Mr. Smith was a man of in-
tegrity and uprightness; highly
esteemed by all who knew him.
He was a kind husband, an indul-
gent father, a true friend and
neighbor and a loyal citizen, as
is pointed out in the following
poem, written especially in his
memory:

His life was long, his words were
few,
He made his vows and kept them
too,
His Promise was with honor
bound

And when he spoke then truth did
sound
Within his home he was a man
There lived a life that few men
can,

In manner kind to friend and foe
His showed forth where'er he'd go.
And lucky is the girl, the lad
Who chose him for their own
granddad

His life is passed; but there lives
on
The memory of the way he done.
How better then this world would
be
If all would live the way did he.

Surviving are his daughter,
Hazel (Mrs. E. G. Meier) her hus-
band, who arrived home from
Portland, Ore., where he is em-
ployed, a few days before Mr.
Smith's death, and two grand-
children, Merlin Meier, a student
at the University of Minnesota
and Lucille, a senior at Nashua
high school.

...came in early, when the moisture
content was as low as 9%, very
low for so early in the season. No.
2 beans are accepted at 14%.

Average yield per acre has
been slightly over 20 bushels,
with some reported up to 33 bu.
Kinds of soybeans raised are:
Richland, Harbaro, Manchu, Illini,
and Mukden, with the earlier va-
rieteis most in favor, according to
W. L. Peterson, manager of the
Equity Ass'n.

Largest Bean Check Over \$2,000

The Equity has paid farmers
about \$125,000 for soybeans de-
livered, with the largest check,
for more than \$2,000, going to Lou
Franke of near Powersville.
Second high check was to Stanley
Feuchtwanger for \$1,454.69 and
third high to McManigle & Mit-
chell for \$1,282.55.

The price range was from \$1.86
per bu (the highest possible price)
paid on over 90% of the early
beans to, in one case, \$1.49. The
average price per bushel for the
season was about \$1.80.

Soybeans have become an im-
portant source for protein feeds,
and also have many manufactur-
ing uses for such things as plastics,
etc., so the large crop raised here
this year is a real contribution to
the war effort.

G. E. Ellison, editor emeritus

condition is not serious.

on a convalescent furlough soon.

Traer established its municipal electric light and power and steam heating plant. Mr. Shortess took keen interest in the plant, and gave much personal time to the planning and management of it for years. Earlier he had served six years on the town council.

Mr. Shortess was very active in Republican party affairs. In 1914 he was elected as Tama county's representative in the lower house of the state general assembly and served two terms. During his second term he was a candidate for speaker of the house, and was defeated by a narrow majority.

During World War I he was chairman of the Red Cross drives and always put Tama county over the top. He was a leader in every movement for public improvements, paving, sewerage system, library, park improvements, the municipal plant, etc. He was one of the earliest advocates of hard surfaced roads for Tama county and did much effective personal work in the state general assembly and as a private citizen to lay the groundwork for the system of roads of which all Iowa is so proud today.

Mr. Shortess was one of the oldest active members of the Masonic fraternity in Iowa, being a member 64 years. He was a member of Traer's Congregational Church.

Mr. and Mrs. Shortess were the parents of two children, Clifford Keith who died July 7, 1936, and Glen who is employed by the Spartan School of Aeronautics at Miami, Oklahoma.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Fifty-first General Assembly, That in the passing of the Honorable F. E. Shortess, the state has lost a valued and honorable citizen and the House would tender, by this resolution, its sincere sympathy to the surviving members of his family, in their sorrow; and

WARD B. SMITH

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the Honorable Ward B. Smith, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Ward B. Smith was born in Old Bradford, near Nashua, Iowa, March 20, 1858. He was the son of Leander and Eliza Smith, one of the pioneer families who helped in the building of the Little Brown Church in the Vale, being very active members.

Mr. Smith received his education at the Bradford Academy and as a young man taught school for a few terms, later representing a harvester company.

On December 21, 1882, he was married to Sarah R. McCreary, who passed away in 1919. Following their marriage they lived in Indianapolis, Indiana, for one year. They returned to make their home on the farm southeast of Nashua. For several years after Mr. Smith left the farm he followed the occupation of stock buyer and in 1904 the family moved to town where Mr. Smith lived until the time of his death.

On January 25, 1922, he was married to Mrs. Luna Bartsch, who died in 1939. Following her death he spent the remaining years of his life with his daughter, Mrs. Lucille Meier. He passed away November 21, 1943.

Mr. Smith served in the Fortieth, Fortieth Extra and the Forty-first General Assemblies of the State Legislature of Iowa. He also served as a member of the Board of Supervisors of Chickasaw county and held various town and church offices and was a member of the Congregational Church and president of the Nashua State Bank.

The following taken from his obituary:

"Mr. Smith was a man of integrity and uprightness, highly esteemed by all who knew him. He was a kind husband, and indulgent father, a true friend, and neighbor and a loyal citizen."

He is survived by an only daughter, her husband, one grandson and one granddaughter.

Merlin Meier, his son-in-law, wrote this poem in honor of his memory:

HONORABLE WARD B. SMITH

"His life was long, his words were few,
He made his vows and kept them too,
His promise was with honor bound
And when he spoke, then truth did sound,
Within his home he was a man
Who lived a life that few men can,
His manner kind to friend and foe
Showed forth where e'er he'd go,
And lucky is the girl, the lad
Who chose him for their own granddad.
His life is past, but there lives on
The memory of the way he won,
How better then this world would be
If all would live the life did he."
