

STRIPPEL DIES; HEART ATTACK

Canner and Former State Representative.

VINTON NEWS

Stricken by a heart attack while in Clarksville attending to business interests, Werner Strippel, prominent 79-year-old Vinton citizen, died at midnight last night at a Waverly hospital.

Mr. Strippel has been subject to heart attacks for the last two years, but was able to continue as manager of the Clarksville Canning Co. With Mrs. Strippel he had been in Clarksville during most of the summer.

Born in Wabern, Germany Aug. 28, 1864, Mr. Strippel came to the United States at the age of 17, settling at Independence, Iowa. Eight years later, in 1889, he went into partnership with Richard Swan at Independence in the undertaking and furniture business. This partnership was dissolved in 1894, when Mr. Strippel came to Vinton to enter into partnership with the late Ethel Young in the same business.

On June 28, 1899, he was married in Vinton to Mollie May Young. In 1919, he withdrew his interests in the partnership and became associated with the Clarksville Canning Co., as manager and secretary and treasurer, the position he continued to hold until his death. He served as president and on the board of directors of the People's Savings bank in Vinton; as a director of the Butler county

Fail to Cut Vegetable Fruit Prices


Washington, Oct. 2.—Sources said today that price administration plans to reduce the consumer price have failed and that similar plans to cut the retail cost of and some 18 fresh vegetables appear to be doomed.

OPA General Manager Bowles told reporters that price reductions that had been planned would lower living costs by 10 per cent.

The first obstacle appeared when OPA prepared a regulation establishing an apple ceiling price of 10 cents a pound. Producers, however, resulting in the proposed ceiling being dropped on orders by economic director Fred M. Bowles, it was said. The new regulation, however, has not yet been officially announced.

The OPA also was preparing an orange regulation establishing an annual average ceiling of 10 cents a pound. In this instance, however, grower protests by congressmen may force a change of plans.

A similar fate for the vegetable ceilings was feared for the citrus measure is also expected.

London Daily Herald said approximately 1,000 American Liberators and Fortresses are based in Britain, indicating during the coming winter British and U. S. air will be able to attack Germany with as high as 4,000 bombs in a single night.

100 TONS IN MONTH

Oct. 2.—Allied planes dropped more than 36,190 tons of bombs on axis targets in Europe and Mediterranean last month, setting records in both the announcements here and at headquarters in Algiers today.

Headquarters of the U. S. army's theater of operations also announced that American Flying Fortresses, Liberators, Marauders and B-24s destroyed or damaged 45 enemy planes over Europe in September compared with 100 planes lost during the month.

Bombing and Liberators dropped 10 tons of high explosives on German targets during 11 missions in 10 operational days, an increase of 53 per cent over August. In September 262 enemy planes, probably shot down 43 and damaged 180, and 185 Fortresses and Liberators were lost, well under the 300 per cent of the total involved. Bombers from the Britain-based U. S. air force dropped 2,000 tons of bombs on enemy targets in Europe during the month, shot down 10 enemy fighters, probably destroyed eight others and damaged 100.

Seven of the speedy, twin-engine Marauders were destroyed and 100 bombers were destroyed 7 for 39.

The force of Thunderbolts destroyed 39 enemy fighters against the loss of seven Thunderbolts.

Air Force bombers operating from Britain were estimated to have dropped about 10,000 tons of explosives in September while the Army bombers
