Former State Representative Dies At 91

Oscar Ulstad, 91, Holmes, former Republican state representative from Wright county died Wednesday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Glenn Amossen, Clear Lake. He was apparently convalescing following hospitalization.

OBITUARY

Oscar Ulstad, was born of parents, Nels and Bertha Ulstad at Creston, Illinois, October 30, 1867. He was baptized into the Christian Faith in infancy and after receiving the usual instruction in the Christian Faith he was confirmed in the Lutheran Church. He has been a resident of Wright County since 1886 and passed away, after a 24 year illness at the home of his daughter Mrs. Glen Amossen near Clear Lake, Iowa Wednesday, May 20, 2:00 p.m. 1959.

Mr. Ulstad was united in marriage to Bella Larson Feb. 27, 1888. Their married life was terminated by the death of his wife October 5, 1904.

Feb. 6, 1906, he was united in marriage to Julia Berven of Thor, Iowa. To this union 4 children were born.

He was instrumental in starting the first Lutheran Sunday School in this community, in a school house west of the present Holmes Lutheran Cemetery. Lutheran worship services were also held at that place. He was also very active in promoting congregational work in this community. He served as Sunday School Superintendent for many years, treasurer of the congregation for approximately 30

years. He was also active in several other Christian activities.

He operated a farm in this community, operated a general store and was Post Master in Holmes for 17 years.

He was also active in other community affairs. In 1916, he was elected to the House of State Representatives and served in this capacity for 10 years. Then, he was elected State Senator and served for 4 years. He was known as a Christian legislator.

Holmes Evangelical Lutheran congregation has lost a faithful member and intercessor. Even though he was not able to attend services, the later part of his life, his heart was constantly in the house of God.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, one sister, Mrs. Sarah Weland, and 4 brothers, Jacob, Samuel, Nels and Martin.

He is survived by his wife, two sons, Norris and Harold of Holmes, Iowa, 3 daughters, Agnes (Mrs. Glen Amossen Clear Lake, Iowa, Ruby, (Mrs. Truman Egemo) Story City, Iowa and Olga, Holmes, Iowa, 6 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren and many other relatives.

Funeral services were held from Eyer Funeral Chapel Saturday, May 23, 1959 at 1:15 p.m. and from Holmes Evangelical Lutheran Church at 2:00 p.m. Pastor B. F. Molstre officiated. Mrs. Theo. Koltvet sang a solo and Mrs. Raymond Thompson and Miss Olena Arfison sang a duet at the service and were accompanied by the organist, Mrs. Donald Mehus. Casket bearers were: Theo. Koltvet, Raymond Thompson, Oscar Erickson, Marvin Lee, James Stroup and John Prehm Jr. Interment was made at Holmes Lutheran Cemetery.

Former postmaster and school board president, he had lived at Holmes since 1887. He was a member of the Lutheran Church in Holmes.

Survivors are his wife, three daughters, Mrs. Amossen, Clear Lake; Mrs. Truman Egemo, Story City; Miss Olga Ulstad, at home; two sons, Harold and Norris, at home, and several grandchildren.

In addition to his very extensive agricultural interests, Mr. James has taken an active interest in other forms of investment, and is a director and stockholder of the Citizens State Bank of Eagle Grove, long having been regarded as one of the most astute business men in this county. He is a Republican, but has never taken a very active part in politics. He is a Mason, a member of the chapter, and is also a member of the Odd Fellows and of the Elks.

OSCAR ULSTAD.

Imbued with the highest ideals of citizenship and possessing an alert mind and true judgment in matters pertaining to community welfare, Oscar Ulstad occupies a place of the highest regard in Wright county, Iowa. He is a man of fine intellectual attainments and broad and positive views. His personality is such as to win to him the greatest regard of those with whom he comes in contact. The admirable traits of character contributed by the Norwegians to the development of industry in this country have been brought into use by Mr. Ulstad in his chosen field of endeavor. He has not only shown a live interest in agricultural affairs, but has proved his ability to fill offices of public trust with the greatest popularity and success.

Oscar Ulstad is a descendant of an old and honored family of Norway. He is the son of Nels and Bertha (Maland) Ulstad, both of whom were native Norwegians. Nels Ulstad received his early education in his native land and after completing the course prescribed for the elementary schools in that county took up the occupation of farming. He worked at this employment until his marriage, when he decided to sail for America with his wife. In 1865 he landed in Montreal, Canada, and from there went directly to Leland, Illinois, where he rented a farm. The agricultural interests on this farm occupied his time and attention for many years. In the year 1875 he was able to purchase a farm of his own consisting of eighty acres. From Leland, Illinois, Mr. Ulstad went to Dayton township, Wright county, Iowa, where he bought eighty acres of land. This land was sold in 1894, and eight years later Mr. Ulstad retired to Eagle Grove, Iowa. Mrs. Ulstad, his wife, who died in 1902, was the mother of the following children: Sarah, Jacob, Oscar, Samuel, Nels and Martin.

Oscar Ulstad was born on the 30th of October, 1867, in LaSalle county,

Illinois. He received his education in the schools of his native state and began to work on the farm for his father at the age of seventeen years. When he was twenty years old he came to Wright county, Iowa, to make an independent living. He rented a farm of one hundred and twenty acres and worked upon it for over two years. At the expiration of that time he went into the mercantile business, where he worked successfully for over a year. The carpenter's trade offered opportunity for profitable employment, and Mr. Ulstad worked at that trade for two years, until he decided to take up the mercantile business again, an occupation he remained interested in until 1912.

During seventeen years of his residence in Iowa, Mr. Ulstad held the office of postmaster at Holmes, an appointment which he filled creditably and honorably until the expiration of his term. The present farm which he occupies is located in Lake township, near Holmes, and extends over seventy acres of land. The place represents everything that is modern in the way of improvements, including over five thousand dollars' worth of improvements, of which sixteen hundred dollars has been spent on tiling. Mr. Ulstad has always manifested an interest in fine horses and owns an imported Percheron. In his active business he uses an automobile.

On February 27, 1888, Oscar Ulstad was married to Belle Larson, a native of Dekalb county, Illinois, and the daughter of O. K. Larson, a retired farmer of Eagle Grove, Iowa. She was a member of an interesting family of five girls. Mrs. Ulstad passed away in 1904. The second marriage of Mr. Ulstad took place on February 6, 1906, when Julia Bervan, a native of Humboldt county, Iowa, became his wife. Her parents, Ole and Julia (Opeheim) Bervin, were natives of Norway, and reared a family of three children. To the union of Mr. and Mrs. Ulstad the following children have been born: Olga, Norris, Agnes and Ruby, all of whom are living at home.

In educational activities Mr. Ulstad has always played a prominent part. His services are valued to the highest degree, as the offices he has held give evidence. For four years he was township trustee, and upon his retirement from office left a record of unusual ability and success. He possesses the faculties which enable him to meet the problems of a political office squarely and sincerely, and as a result has enjoyed a wide popularity. He held the office of township assessor for one term and was school director for two years. At the present time he is president of the school board of his district and is also clerk of the township. The Lutheran church at Holmes

is the place of worship attended by Mr. Ulstad, and he has a wide acquaintance among the members of that congregation, gained through his duties as secretary of the church. The Republican party has held Mr. Ulstad as an earnest advocate of its principles, and he continues to serve its causes to the best of his ability as a true citizen.

CYRUS H. PORTER.

Cyrus H. Porter, prominent farmer, extensive stock raiser and successful business man, was born in Bureau county, Illinois, on October 1, 1858, the son of Albert G. and Caroline P. (Howard) Porter, natives of Seneca county, New York, and near Boston, Massachusetts, respectively. The Porter family is of English descent and they have a genealogical record back to William the Conqueror, one of the family having been his bodyguard. The Howard family genealogy is traced to the time of the "Mayflower," one of the family having come to America on that boat.

Albert G. and Caroline Porter, shortly after their marriage, which took place at Detroit, Michigan, went to Bureau county, Illinois, about 1834, where they settled on a farm on which they lived for fifty years. About 1883 Albert G. Porter moved to Waterloo, Iowa, where his wife died in 1891, after which the elder Porter went to Des Moines, Iowa, where he lived the greater part of the time until his death, on August 18, 1897. Albert G. and Caroline P. Porter were the parents of sixteen children, seven of whom are living, namely: Alonzo L., of Chicago, Illinois; Albert E., of Los Angeles, California; Mrs. Lucy Palmer, of Des Moines, Iowa; Mrs. Hepzibah Bruce, of Walter, Oklahoma; Henry K., of Shellrock, Iowa; Mrs. Ida J. Hetzler, of Durant, Iowa; and Cyrus, the subject of this sketch.

Cyrus H. Porter received only a limited education as a boy, finding it necessary to leave school when fourteen years of age, when he became a fireman on the Indiana, Bloomington & Western steam railroad, a line of work which he followed for nine years. In 1883 Cyrus H. Porter came to Wright county, where he had purchased a farm of one hundred and sixty acres in section 33, Eagle Grove township, during the fall of 1882. Being prairie land, Cyrus H. Porter broke up the soil, improved his place with substantial buildings, later added eight and one-half acres of pasture land and now has one of the best farms to be found in the county. Mr. Porter is now engaged in general farming and in the breeding of "large type"


