O. J. Reimers died last week in Sioux Falls

Otto J. Reimers, prominent Lyon county citizen for more than a half century, died Thursday morning in a Sioux Falls nursing home. He was 89, and had been in poor health for some time.

Funeral services were held Saturday at 2 p.m. in the Congregational church with the Rev. R. R. Teeuwen officiating. Organist for the services was Mrs Gordon LeBoutillier, and Pierre Landman sang two solos — "Our God, Our Help in Ages Past," and "Dear Lord and Father of Mankind."

Burial was in the Riverview cemetery here with Masonic Rites by Border Lodge No. 406. Jongewaard Funeral home was in charge of arrangements.





Reimers, a son of John H. Reimers
and Carolena Clasen, was born in Scott
County, Iowa, on March 16, 1878. He
attended the Rock Rapids High school
and after graduating, enrolled in Western
Union college at LeMars.

After completing his college education,
Reimers taught in Lyon county schools
for four years. On February 22, 1905,
he married Ella Rohde and the couple
farmed in the county until 1920. Reimers
was a state representative in the General
Assembly of Iowa for eight years, and
was admitted to the Iowa bar in 1929.

He practiced law in Rock Rapids for
several years and served as county at-
torney in 1933 and 1934. In addition; he
has been active in many local clubs
and organizations, including Kiwanis Lt.
Governor, chairman of the Rock Rapids
Civic Advisory committee, president of
Farm Bureau, commercial club director,
AF and AM Masonic lodge, Knights of
Pythias, Independent Order of Odd Fel-
lows, and member of the Congregational
church.

In 1942, Reimers was nominated by the
democratic party to fill the unexpired
term of Vincent Harrington in the U.S.
Congress.



shop at Little Rock. In this enterprise he was meeting with much success when in 1868, at the call of his friends in the Republican party, he became a candidate for the office of auditor of Lyon county. In the election that followed he was successful, receiving a majority of two hundred and nine votes over his competitor. In 1900 he was again elected, this time having a majority of four hundred and thirty-three votes; in 1902 he was a third time elected to the same position, this time his majority being two hundred and seventy-five votes. The county was organized in 1871 and he is the tenth man elected to this position. He was the first man in Lyon county to hold the office of auditor three terms since the organization of the county.

Mr. Dietrich is associated with the People's church with which he has been connected since 1892, and with his good wife has worked hard to build it up until it has become one of the leading religious organizations of the city.

Mr. Dietrich was married December 22, 1887, to Miss Magdeline M., a daughter of Henry and Jane (Waldron) Shaw. Her father was a successful farmer, and was killed by an accident at the age of fifty-six years. He came of Holland ancestry, while his wife traced back her origin to an old English family. Her family wore a

coat of arms which still remains. To this marriage have come six children: Earnest Oscar; Ada Grace; Blanche Magdalene; Chandon; Helen Jane; and George Earl.

C. E. Dietrich, the father of George F., was a man of note in his day,—although a tailor by trade. He was a close student of the questions of the day; and to crown his declining years wrote a book on the "Solution of the Social Problem." This was published after his death, as it was coming out from the press of the Schultz Publishing Company as he was passing away, at the age of seventy-seven years. This however, has been a popular work, and has received marked approbation from those competent to measure its value. He was born in Germany, and came to this country when about twenty-one years of age, locating in Baltimore, where he was married to Margaret Feldkirchner, also a native of Germany. From her Bavarian home she came with her brother while still a young girl to this country, and here she found her husband.

Mr. Reimers was born in Germany in 1849, where he was reared on a farm, and well prepared for that honorable

and useful career which he has led in the United States. Here he has had his home since 1868, and his loyalty to his adopted land is beyond question. He is thoroughly Americanized, and is proud of the land which has given him such a generous welcome. His home is in Doon township, Lyon county, where he has lived many years.

In May, 1868, Mr. Reimers arrived in Scott county, Iowa, coming from Germany, and for a time was employed as a farm hand. In 1873 he began farming for himself, and the following year was married to Miss Caroline Elizabeth Clasen. She was also born in Germany, and by her marriage with Mr. Reimers has become the mother of four children: Otto J., Meta E., Mary C., and Clara S.

Mr. Reimers removed to Cedar county, Iowa, where he maintained his home three years. In March, 1885, he located in Lyon county, having already bought a farm in Cleveland township the previous year. In the spring of 1885 he bought his present property, the northeast quarter of section 1, Doon township, on which some few and simple improvements had already been made. In 1889 he bought the northwest quarter of section 6, Garfield township, and at the present time owns three hundred and fifty-six acres, all improved, and furnished with

about the finest set of farm buildings to be found in the county. He devotes his attention principally to stock and grain raising, and has made a very great success of his various agricultural enterprises. In these years in which he has been a citizen of Doon township he has built up a magnificent farm, and made for his family a noble and commanding home.

In political matters Mr. Reimers generally takes strong Democratic ground, and has served as town trustee, and has been appointed supervisor to fill a vacancy on the county board. In his own district he has been school director, and has always been ready to meet every duty as a man and a citizen. His upright and honorable career should be an encouragement to the young men of the present generation, as in it they can see what thrift and industry, honesty and integrity can always accomplish.


