Heart Attack Fatal To Judge Vincent

Dies Suddenly At Home Here; Service Monday

The community lost one of its most distinguished and respected citizens when Judge Earl W. Vincent, 67, died at his home Friday night. Death was caused by a coronary occlusion.

Judge Vincent had held court in Winterset Friday, and returned to his home here, in apparently good health. He retired at 9:30, after expressing some discomfort from what he termed a stomach disorder, and it was not until about 11 o'clock that he became seriously ill. A doctor was summoned, but the fatal attack had set in.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock from the First Presbyterian church in Guthrie Center. Rev. M. G. Wilkinson officiated. Interment was in Union cemetery. Pallbearers were Howard Gillespie, R. C. Norman, G. M. Barnett, Sr., C. K. Batschelet, George Sournas, John Pritchard.

Judge Vincent began an illustrious and distinguished career in law when he established practice in Guthrie Center following his admission to the Iowa bar in 1912, when he was a partner in the law firm of Weeks and Vincent. Later, he and J. E. Batschelet became partners in the firm of Batschelet and Vincent.

Born in Keota, Ia., March 27, 1886, Judge Vincent attended school there, and college in Monmouth (Ill.) College, where he received his A.B. and A.M. degrees. He received his LL.B. degree from the State University of Iowa in 1912.

He was married June 8, 1916, to the former Madge Lee, who survives. Both live in Guthrie Center.

He was married June 8, 1916, to the former Madge Lee, who survives him. One daughter, Marjorie Lee, (Mrs. R. Y. Taylor) also survives. Both live in Guthrie Center.

Known for the honesty and integrity he characterized all of his life, Judge Vincent became one of the state's most renowned lawyers. He served as county attorney of Guthrie county from 1919-1922, after which he served two terms as county representative in the Iowa Assembly.

He culminated his political activities in 1928 when he won election to the U. S. congress as Representative from the 9th Iowa District. He was favored for reelection to that office in 1930, but declined to make the race to resume his practice in Guthrie Center.

He was appointed a Judge of District court of Iowa in 1945, and had held that position until his death.

Possessing a keen legal interpretative mind, Judge Vincent was acclaimed throughout the state as representative of the highest rank in the profession. When a vacancy occurred on the Iowa supreme court bench this winter, he was considered one of the most outstanding candidates for the appointment, but he declined to enter a serious bid for the position.

Active in all sorts of community and civic work, Judge Vincent was a charter member of the Guthrie Center Lions Club, and a past District Governor of the Lions.

He was a member of the American Bar Association, the Iowa State Bar Association, and several civic organizations. Fraternities included Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Phi Delta Phi, and Sigma Delta Phi. He was an active Republican and a member of the First Presbyterian church here.

He is survived by his wife and daughter, a brother, Elmer of Keota, and three sisters, Mrs. Mae Sturgeon of Keota, Mrs. Charles Welmer of California and Grace Vincent of Keota. Many nieces and nephews also survive.

Judge Earl Vincent Dies in Guthrie Home

Judge Earl W. Vincent, 67, died suddenly at his home in Guthrie Center Friday night from coronary occlusion. Although he had spent some time in a hospital recently his general health had been considered good.

He held court in Winterset earlier in the day but complained of being ill that evening. Death came shortly before midnight.

He had been a lawyer in Guthrie Center from 1912 until 1945 when he became a judge of the circuit court. He had been county attorney, he served in the Iowa legislature and he filled out an unexpired term in the congress of the United States.

He is survived by his wife and one daughter, Mrs. Robert Y. Taylor, of Guthrie Center.

Final rites were held for Judge Vincent from the First Presbyterian church in Guthrie Center Monday afternoon. Interment was made in the Union cemetery nearby.
