## 178 APPLY FOR MATTRESS WORK

Applications in for 340 Mattress-  
es to be Made Under Direc-  
tion of Home Demon-  
stration Agent.

One hundred seventy-eight ap-  
plications for surplus cotton to  
be made into 340 mattresses have  
been received to date by the  
county extension office, accord-  
ing to Miss Jennie Marie War-  
ren, county home agent. Con-  
struction of the mattresses will  
begin as soon as possible, Miss  
Warren said.

Applicants will meet at the  
designated work centers and will  
receive instructions and the ma-  
terials needed. Both men and  
women will help with the con-  
struction, since it involves some  
heavy work. Applicants are be-  
ing certified by the Triple A or-  
ganization, which is cooperating  
with the Extension Service and  
the Surplus Marketing Adminis-  
tration in the mattress program.  
The program is designed to im-  
prove farm family living and at  
the same time utilize some of the  
surplus cotton in the country.

## ROY HANEY DIED SUDDENLY MONDAY WHILE IN RED OAK

Prominent Glenwood Citizen, For-  
mer State Representative and  
Ex-Mayor Stricken. Funeral  
Service Friday Afternoon.

Roy Haney, 62, prominent real  
estate agent of Glenwood, passed  
away suddenly Monday afternoon  
at four o'clock in the office of Dr.  
C. C. Nelson in Red Oak. He had  
gone to Red Oak on business and  
apparently became ill, but upon  
reaching the doctor's office, he  
immediately slumped in a chair,  
and was dead. His business asso-  
ciate, Bert Colwell, whose name  
was found upon papers Mr. Haney  
was carrying, was summoned to  
Red Oak at once, but was not ad-  
vised of his death until he reach-  
ed there.

Mr. Haney was born on a farm  
near Silver City July 28, 1879.  
Being among the older sons of a  
large family, he assumed leader-  
ship in the family group at an  
early age, upon the death of his  
father. Thirty-five years ago, he  
was united in marriage to Pearl  
Mintle of Glenwood, who survives  
him, as does also his aged mother,  
Mrs. Rachel Haney. He leaves  
also two sisters, Mrs. Maggie  
Horton of Glenwood and Mrs. I.  
O. Hunt of Old Shasta, Calif.,  
and five brothers, J. R. Haney of  
Cannon Ball, N. D., Alva of  
Homedale, Idaho, Charles E. of  
Hollywood, Calif., Will of Kuna,  
Idaho and Wallace of Tabor.

Mr. Haney, who was always a  
civic leader, was an ex-mayor of  
Glenwood and had served two  
terms in the Iowa legislature as  
the representative of Mills coun-  
ty. At the time of his death,  
he was president of the Mills  
County Building & Loan Associa-  
tion, past president and director  
of the Glenwood Chamber of  
Commerce, a member of the of-  
ficial board of the Methodist  
church and an active participant  
in politics and Masonic affairs.

His body was brought to the  
Myers-James Funeral home in  
this city where it will lie in state  
until the hour of the funeral ser-  
vice which will be held in the  
Glenwood Methodist church Fri-  
day afternoon at 2:30 o'clock.
