MARTIN H. TROUP

Martin H. Troup, 86, prominent Story County businessman and former Iowa legislator, died at noon, Sept. 30, 1963, at the Story County Hospital at Nevada, following a long illness.

Born in Story County, Mr. Troup had lived most of his life in Maxwell, except for a period of time in which he engaged in the banking business at Rodes and Collins, Iowa. In Maxwell he was chiefly concerned with the banking, insurance and real estate business for many years.

During the twenties, Mr. Troup served several terms in the House of Representatives and always maintained his interest in politics and government.

He was a fifty-year member of Herald Lodge, No. 455 A. F. & A. M. and Annie Laurie Chapter, O. E. S. Also a member of the Board of Directors of the Story County Hospital in Nevada, since its inception in 1951.

Survivors include his wife, the former Mrs. Charlotte Ziegler of Atlantic and Des Moines. Two daughters, Mrs. Olive Greeley of Redlands, Calif., and Mrs. Carol Borg of Baraboo, Wis.

Services were held Wednesday, Oct. 2, at 2 p. m. at the Maxwell Methodist Church, during which time business houses were closed. Rev. J. E. McClellan officiated and Mrs. Madeline Summitt furnished organ music. Casket bearers were Hugh Olinger, Emmett Scott, Russell Sparks, Delbert Pfeiffer, Raymond Robertson and Robert Kirk.

A memorial fund has been established for the Methodist Church, where he has held his membership for many years.

Word received from Harold Gamble, who is a student at Iowa State Teachers College at Cedar Falls, states they have a 62 piece band of which he has been elected president.



What is the Cure?

We hear of so many plans and ideas of dealing with juvenile crimes, adult crimes and mental breakdowns that we ask the question, are these plans cures and do they prevent further crime?

In days gone by, offenders were restrained by walls and bars for periods. In severe cases, the state took a life. For the mental patients, it was often life in an institution.

Now with parole, treatments and all kinds of work and diversions, these people are being returned, in some measure, to normal life.

But the rate of increase keeps up. It grows. More youth is taken in. More are in trouble.

What's the cure? Is there any way to vaccinate them against crime? We do little until they are in trouble, often far gone.

We often ask ourselves why we do vicious, mean, cruel and heartless things? What's wrong with people who rob, steal, beat and kill?

There are those who believe that man was born a sinful, vicious creature and lay the blame on Adam, Eve, Cain and others. We are not born honest, fair, kind and forgiving. We are jealous, we are predatory, we will injure and kill with little provocation.

Jealousy springs up in the breast of man instantly. Few people are without it. Professional jealousy, jealousy because of appearance, position in life, accomplishments, wealth—it is universal. And the love of money—from the poverty stricken person to one of great means—is a consuming passion.

What is the cure for this lack of integrity, this jealousy, this violence that is ours? What cures race prejudice?

What will warm a man's heart, produce kindness, relieve jealousy, increase charity, cultivate forgiveness, promote honesty, broot selfishness, lift eyes up to noble and pure things?

Do degrees from colleges and universities do it? Does world travel do it? Does economic competition do it?

We leave the question. What is the cure? What will lift up this thinking in our hearts?

Martin H. Troup, 86, prominent Story County businessman, died at noon Monday at the Story County Hospital in Nevada.

A resident of Maxwell, Troup had been in failing health for the past several months.

Funeral services will be Wednesday, Oct. 2, at 2 p.m. at the Maxwell Methodist Church. The Rev. J. E. McClellan will officiate and burial will be in the Maxwell Cemetery.

Business houses in Maxwell will be closed during the hours of the funeral service, from 1:30 to 3 p.m.

A native of Story County, Troup lived most of his life in Maxwell. He was a banker and had worked in banks in Rhodes, Collins and Maxwell, but for the past several years had been chiefly concerned with insurance and real estate.

Troup served at least two terms in the Iowa House of Representatives, back in the twenties, and had a continuing interest in politics and government.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge and Order of Eastern Star. He was a member of the Board of Directors of the Story County Hospital in Nevada, a position he filled since the hospital was built in 1951.

Survivors include his wife, the former Charlotte Ziegler of Atlantic and Des Moines, and two daughters, Mrs. Olive Greeley of Redlands, Calif., and Mrs. Carol Sorg of Baraboo, Wis.

A memorial fund for the Maxwell Methodist Church has been established.

Eight Hundred And Twelve Have Chest X-Rays in County

Eight hundred and twelve persons in Story County had miniature X-rays during a recent visit of the mobile X-ray unit.

The report disclosed 28 persons with chest abnormalities, indicating possible tumors, heart conditions, cancer, etc.

Five persons were referred for larger X-rays. The larger plates, 14 x 17, help the radiologist or identify the type of abnormality.

Henry and Anne Nalley Troup

Henry Harrison Troup was born in Weland County, Canada, in 1839, to Benjamin and Mary Benner Troup, both of Pennsylvania.

At age 13, Henry moved with his family to Elkhart, Indiana, where he lived until the age of 17, at which time he came to Story County, Iowa, where he worked

as a farmhand for Joseph Brubaker.

During the early 1860's, young Henry took a wagon train to California to prospect for gold. In 1867, Henry took a ship in San Francisco and returned to Iowa via Cape Horn and New York. On his return to Iowa, Henry married Anne Rebecca Nalley on September 27, 1868, near Mt. Morris, Illinois. Anne was born in Ogle County, Illinois, in 1849, to Solomon and Mary Anne Morsberg Nalley, both of Pennsylvania.

Henry and his bride homesteaded just south of Story County until 1909 when they moved to Maxwell. During this time, seven children were born: Will, **Martin**, Walter, Rollo, Jake, Benjamin and Emma (Devilbliss).

Henry was a member of the Brethren Church for 45 years and a minister of the gospel for 35 years. The Brethren Cemetery south of Maxwell is located on part of the Troup homestead. The Troup family plot is located in this cemetery.

Henry and Anne Troup had the following children who lived in Maxwell.

William, who married Anna Garlock, had one daughter, Inez Johanson, and two sons, Harry and Hubert. Harry Troup married Mary Randol. Their daughters were Jolene, Maureen, Harriet, Kay and Beth. Their sons were Charles "Bill" and Ray. Jolene married Don Mathis, Harriet married Dean Erickson, Kay married Dave Zeiser and Beth married Bill Griffith. Ray married Sharel Robertson. Bill Troup lives in Center Point and is a practicing veterinarian. The rest of the family all lives in Maxwell.

Martin, son of Henry and Anne Troup married Rose Randall. They had one daughter, Olive, who married Fred Greeley.

Henry and Anne's son, Jacob Troup, who married Mary Randall, had a daughter, Ione, who married Henry Wax. They had four daughters: Adeline, who married Charles Bishop and lives in Maxwell; Mary, Wilma and Emma who live out of town.

Henry and Anne's son, Walter, married Pearl Hollenbeck. Their daughter, Vera, married Walter Woodard. They had one son William and three daughters, Ellen Lucille, who married Arnold Kueker; Elizabeth, who married Wilbur Gamble; and Pearle Marie, who married Lee Elder. Walter and Pearl's daughter, Ruth, married John Jackson. They had two daughters: R. Maude, who married Garol Cooling; and Mary, who married Joe Griffith. Walter and Pearl's son, Howard H., married Catherine Simmins. They had two sons, Howard H. Jr. and Gerald L.

John R. and Hazel Oaks Vallandingham

John R. Vallandingham and Hazel M. Vallandingham came to Maxwell in November of 1921. They purchased a grocery store which they called Jack's Cash and Carry. They came from Des Moines where they had a store on Army Post Road. When they bought the store in Maxwell, it was only one half the size it later became when they purchased the rest of the building from Carters who had a butcher shop. They lived upstairs over the store.

John was born on December 22, 1886. Hazel was born November 1, 1889. They had two children when they came to Maxwell. Louise, born January 7, 1908, was 13. Jack, born July 31, 1917, was 5.

Jack married Aileen Boucher from Mingo, Iowa. They had two children: Jack Jr. and Sandra.

John and Hazel operated the store until 1951 when John passed away. Then their son Jack and his wife Aileen took over the management of the store. In 1965 they sold out and moved to California. Jack and Aileen

are both deceased. Jack died in May 1976 and Aileen in December of 1980.

Jack Robert Vallandingham Jr. married Mary Law of Maxwell. They have four children: John, Adam, Mollie and Jenny. They live in Fort Dodge where Jack is a pharmacist and operates a drug store.

Sandra Vallandingham married John (Jerry) Longnecker. They have three sons: Tim, Todd and Troy. They live northeast of Maxwell. Jerry works at the John Deere plant in Ankeny.

Hazel M. Vallandingham still lives in her home in Maxwell. She is a 50 year member of the Order of Eastern Star, belongs to the Alpha Delphian Club, the Wen Lead Bridge Club and is a lifetime member of the Maxwell Christian Church.

William E. and Mary Myers Van Hook

William E. Van Hook was born in 1895. He drove a wagon from Des Moines for Wells Fargo and Company as a working youth. Mary L. Myers was born in 1894. Her childhood included considerable covered wagon migration. She did girlhood work in domestics and was an employee of Swift and Company in Des Moines.

They married in 1916 and became Maxwell community residents in 1918.

Bill helped in construction of the Farrar School building and worked as farm laborer from 1918 to 1922 in Farrar. They farmed from 1922 to 1929 near Farrar and Maxwell. The era included a short stint in a traveling tent show business and five years of driving a horse drawn school bus for Farrar school. They had a family operated farm produce business from 1930 to 1952 in Maxwell.
