It is my impression that the present Congress is not going to get too excited about anything and that the majority of its members are going to try d iffully hard to hold the line. Our present fiscal situation causes grave concern, and all attempts to lodge more power in the Executive Branch of the Government are viewed with a jaudiced eye. Actually, the less legislation this Congress passes, the more money will be saved for our overburdened taxpayers. There are a lot of legislative proposals, as desirable as they may be to some people, which can well be put on the shelf until we can find out just where we are going.
