

Life Story

Wilbur Fiske Hubbard was born on a farm near Underwood, Iowa on March 24, 1885, the son of Atkins T. and Mary J. Hubbard. His early education was acquired in a rural school close to his home. The family moved to a farm near Neola, Iowa, in 1898 and he entered the Neola Public High School and graduated with the class of 1902.

On August 19, 1939, he was united in marriage with Vera L. Hamilton, at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph A. Hamilton. This is the same home in Neola which the Wilbur F. Hubbard's have maintained since retiring from farming in 1942. Before leaving the farm Mr. Hubbard had also been writing farm insurance as an agent for the Pottawattamie County Mutual for 13 years. On account of ill health he sold his agency in 1948 to Clifford Campbell.

The Hubbards had four children Joseph A., Neal H., Verna L., and Wilbur L. Wilbur F preceded in death by his parents, his brother John N. Hubbard, a sister Mrs. Louise Sealock and the son, Neal Hamilton Hubbard.

Besides his farming and insurance he served as a State Representative from Pottawattamie Co. in the 41st, 42nd and 43rd sessions of Iowa General Assembly. He was an elder in the First Presby- terian church. He also served for one year as the County Agricultural Agent in the County Agricultural Agent in 1921. He has been a member of Agate Lodge No. 423 A.F. & A.M. in Neola for 63 years and of Agatha Chapter No. 192, Order of the Eastern Star for 62 years.

He leaves his wife, the three children, 9 grand children and 8 great grand children.

At a meeting of the Neola Swim Pool Board and time certificate holders, daily admission fees for adults were set at 75c and for students, grades thru 12th were set at 50c. Youngsters who use the baby pool admitted free.

Family rates have been discontinued but adults may buy season tickets for \$15, and season tickets for student's have been set at \$10. Or, adults may buy a book of 20 tickets for \$10, and students may buy a book of 20 tickets for \$7.50

As was the custom last year no concessions such as pop, popcorn and candy bars will be offered.

In other business it was decided to open the pool on May 30 and operate the pool for a period of 12 weeks, with the closing date set for August 22, the last week of the summer vacation.
