Snowmobiles may use some city streets

The Rock Rapids city council Monday night approved a resolution designating certain streets as snowmobile routes for use in traveling to or from the city limits.

The resolution was approved after presentation of a petition requesting the designation. The petition contained about 350 signatures of interested citizens.

The resolution states that snowmobiles will be allowed, on designated streets, to travel from a destination in the city to the city limits and vice versa. The designated streets are South Third avenue, South Fifth avenue, South 12th avenue, Tama street and North Second avenue and North Union street. The snowmobiles are directed to travel the most direct route from places where they are kept to the nearest of the designated streets.

The resolution further states that snowmobiles may be operated in Westside park between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. during the winter months except at such times as prohibited due to lack of snow.

In other action, the council approved a new city ordinance relating

to the removal of snow sidewalks. The ordinance states that the city may remove snow from public sidewalk 24 hours after a snowfall has stopped and the owner will be assessed for the cost of snow removal. The ordinance stated the city will be authorized to remove the snow within 24 hours after the snowfall, but it is said this is physically impossible to do.

The council also adopted a resolution accepting the improvements work at \$117,311.50 and a preliminary to assess property owners for improvements on Tama street. A public hearing
