Retired Federal Judge Edwin R. Hicklin, 68, died Thursday, Sept. 19 at Burlington hospital at 3:35 a.m. following an extended period of ill health. He was admitted to the hospital Sept. 16.

He retired three years ago after serving in the southern district of Iowa since 1957. He was appointed to the bench by President Dwight Eisenhower, whose campaign he managed in Iowa.
