Miss Gustafson is a senior at Aurelia and member of All-State Orchestra for three years. She played first chair oboe in the Augustana College festival band.


Rodney Hazen of Meriden-Clegorn school will play Allegro maestoso and Allegro Marziale nimato from Piano Concerto No. 2.

Condemning For Recreation Is Held Valid

DES MOINES (AP)—Attorney Evan Hultman ruled Friday that a legislative bill to permit corporations to condemn water recreation projects unconstitutional.

The opinion was requested by Sen. A.V. Doran, R-Boonville, who opposes the bill.

Hultman said any project proposed for development under the measure would have to pass several tests. They include:

The public use must predominate in the whole project.

Any and all land taken under condemnation must forever remain open to the public use.

At least 25 per cent of the line of the water area must remain forever available for the public use.

All of the water area must remain open to the public at all times.

Hultman told a news conference the bill would give the State Conservation Commission broader authority to set almost any conditions for approval of a project.

He said, for example, the commission might require the developer to carry on such maintenance as grass cutting and mowing of picnic facilities. It also might require the developer to provide public portions of the project.

Lew McDonald, 79, prominent Cherokee attorney and a former Iowa state senator, died here late Friday afternoon.

McDonald suffered an apparent heart attack as he was sitting in his car on West Main Street in the business district.

He and his wife, Olive, had just returned from a vacation trip.

McDonald was well known in Northwest Iowa legal, civic and fraternal circles.

He was the senior partner in the city law firm of McDonald, Sayre and McDonald.

McDonald served as Cherokee County attorney from 1917 to 1927. **State Senator**

He was a Republican state senator in this district from 1929-1933.

The lawyer was a past president of the Cherokee Chamber of Commerce and was a member of Masonic Blue Lodge and Rotary Club.

McDonald was also well known as an educator in his earlier years.

He held the county superintendent of schools post here from 1913-1916. Prior to that he was on the Iowa State Teachers College faculty for one year.

McDonald established his law practice in the city on Jan. 1, 1917.

He attended State Teachers from 1903-1907, the University of Michigan, 1909-1910 and later received his Ph.D and J. D. degrees from the University of Chicago in 1912.

He graduated from Meriden High School.

A 50-year member of the Iowa State Bar Association, McDonald had been practicing 45 years.

He was past president of the Cherokee County Bar Association and a half-century member of Speculative Lodge 307, A. F. & A. M. McDonald was a charter member of Cherokee Country Club.

He had been a Cherokee County resident nearly all his life.

The family home was at 518 West Cedar.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John McDonald and three brothers — William, Dewey and John.

He was a member of Memorial Presbyterian Church. He was married to Olive Johnson on June 11, 1914.

McDonald was born in Aurora, Ill., on March 2, 1884, the son of Mr. and Mrs. John McDonald.


