



Production testing and sampling procedures were supervised by Iowa State University in cooperation with the official Holstein breed improvement programs.



Total nutrient testing as sponsored by the Holstein Association is in step with today's consumer demands. It provides the Holstein breeder with information for improving the overall performance of his herd and the homemaker with a measure of milk's food value.




