JOHN H. SCHROEDER

John H. Schroeder, 93, retired farmer of the Arcadia community who represented Carroll County in the Iowa Legislature in 1933 and 1934, died at 1:30 Thursday morning in the Carroll Nursing Home after being in failing health the last year.

Funeral services will be at 9:30 a.m. Saturday in St. John's Church at Arcadia. Requiem mass will be offered by the Rev. Cletus Ahmann. Burial will be in St. John's Cemetery.

Friends may call after 7 p.m. Thursday at the Sharp Funeral Home, where the rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. Thursday and 8 p.m. Friday. Fr. Ahmann will lead the recitation Friday night.

Mr. Schroeder, son of Henry and Philomena Schroeder, was born July 28, 1865, at New Vienna, Iowa. After his graduation from St. Boniface Parochial School at New Vienna, he attended Iowa State Teachers College at Cedar Falls.

As a young man he was a high school teacher in Granville, Akron and other schools.

He was married to Paulina Bunker Brumsman June 6, 1893, at St. Boniface Church in New Vienna. After leaving the teaching profession, Mr. Schroeder farmed near Arcadia until 1926.

While farming, he was employed by the Iowa Farm Bureau as membership solicitor for the State of Iowa. He also organized the Land o' Lakes Cooperative Creameries in Minnesota.

After his wife's death, Sept. 1, 1942, Mr. Schroeder divided the time among the homes of his children until November, 1956, when he went to the home of Mrs. W. R. Macke and the late Mr. Macke in Carroll. He lived there until October, 1958, when he entered St. Anthony Hospital where he remained until February, 1959. He had been at the Carroll Nursing Home the last four months.

Mr. Schroeder had been active in the Democratic party.

Surviving are two sons, Walter and John A. Schroeder, Arcadia; two daughters, Mrs. Ben (Alvera) Haverkamp, Arcadia, and Mrs. A. E. (Delores) Bennett, Omaha; a stepdaughter, Mrs. Alvina Kaiser, Randolph, Neb.; one sister, Mrs. Mary Pilmaier, Omaha, and a half-brother, Joe Rebker, Arcadia.

Deceased children are two daughters, Mrs. Loretta Cantril and Mrs. Lovella Pick, and a son, Paulus, in infancy.

FRANCIS SCHWENDEMANN

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Francis Schwendemann, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Francis Schwendemann was born on a farm near Burnside, Webster County, Iowa, May 19, 1887. He was educated in the rural schools and at Tobin College, Fort Dodge, and taught in the public schools three years. Then he went to Ward County, North Dakota, where he taught school and homesteaded eighty acres of land. He returned to Iowa in 1911 and started farming.

He married Mildred Lundgren on May 11, 1915, and they had two sons and two daughters. He helped organize the Webster County Farm Bureau and the Iowa Farm Bureau Federation. He served as Farm Bureau president, secretary and director; and was county agricultural agent from 1921 to 1923. Since 1923, he farmed and bred Belgian horses, Holstein cattle and Hampshire swine. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge and the Methodist Church; and also served on Webster County and Duncombe city boards of education.

Mr. Schwendemann served as a member of the Forty-eighth session of the General Assembly of the State of Iowa. After his service in the legislature, he was secretary of the Farmers Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Fort Dodge. Mr. Schwendemann also served as Webster County inheritance tax appraiser.

He passed away May 24, 1960, at the age of seventy-three, at Fort Dodge, Iowa.

Surviving him are his widow and four children: Mrs. Robert Horn, Mrs. Lloyd Fuhrmeister, Donald Schwendemann and LeRoy Schwendemann. Also surviving are twelve grandchildren, five brothers and two sisters. Two sisters preceded him in death.
