Frank G. Snyder, 90, former Jewell businessman and state representative from Hamilton county, died at the Lutheran hospital, Fort Dodge early last Friday morning, December 28. He had been a patient at the hospital since Thursday, December 20.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at Eldora at the Longnecker funeral home. Burial was in the cemetery at Eldora.

Mr. Snyder was born at Brooklyn, Poweshiek county, Iowa, and was located at Eldora, Iowa before moving to Jewell in June, 1891 where he engaged in the general merchandise business. After 18 years he took over the Ford agency in Jewell and later entered partnership with Fred Kayser at Webster City where they operated the Snyder-Kayser Ford Garage for many years.

He served in the army during World War I, and also served for one year in the Red Cross with the American forces in France. He was discharged with the commission of major in 1919.

His two sons, Richard and Frank, Jr. also served in the war, the former in the navy and the latter in the army.

For many years, Mr. Snyder was active in the Hamilton County Red Cross and similar civic organizations.

A life-long Republican, he was elected to the Iowa house of representatives in the early 1930's and served several terms.

He was interested in agriculture and owned considerable farm property in Liberty township, and also at one time owned land in other sectors of Iowa, Minnesota and the Dakotas.

Following his retirement from business, he and his wife continued to reside in Webster City until several years ago when they moved to Fort Dodge where they have since been residents of Friendship Haven.

Surviving are his wife and two sons, Richard and Frank, Jr., both living in Michigan.

Frank Snyder, 90, Services Held Here Monday

One of First Ford Distributors In This Section

Funeral services for Frank G. Snyder, 90, were held Monday at 2 p. m. at the Longenecker Funeral Home here with the Rev. Ralph Imes in charge. Mr. Snyder lived in Eldora as a young man and married Clara Mabel Farrow of Eldora in 1891.

Mr. and Mrs. Snyder had been making their home at Friendship Haven in Fort Dodge the past few years. Mr. Snyder passed away Dec. 28 at a Fort Dodge hospital.


Casket bearers Monday were James Heslop, John Piper, Russell Roupe, T. E. Monteith, Lloyd Palmitier and Carl Piper. Mrs. W. H. Van Tiger and Mrs. L. K. Welsh were in charge of flowers. Burial was in the Eldora cemetery.

Mr. Snyder was born Nov. 11, 1866, at Brooklyn, Ia., the son of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Snyder. He attended school at Conrad, Toledo and Mt. Morris Academy at Mt. Morris, Ill. Following his marriage Mr. Snyder moved to Jewell, Ia., where he operated a general store for 20 years. He organized the Jewell Telephone Co., and was the first Ford car distributor for Hamilton and Hardin counties. He served in World War I and in 1931 was named in charge of the Iowa exhibit at the Chicago Century of Progress exposition.

Mr. Snyder was selected state representative from Hamilton county two terms, was active in city, school and church organizations, the Rotary club and Masonic lodge.

He is survived by his widow; two sons, Richard of Saginaw, Mich., Frank, Jr., of Traverse City, Mich., and two grandsons, Frank G. Snyder III of Saginaw and James L., a student at Albion college, Albion, Mich. Three brothers and four sisters preceded him in death.


