He was born in Lawler Feb. 9,
1890, the son of Albert Zipse and
Margaret Heiselman Zipse. He

1913 to 1933 he worked in Clay
and Chickasaw counties. He
worked in new Hampton from
1937 to 1944. From 1944 until his
death he worked in Spirit Lake.

He worked as a farmer, and
carpenter and served as state
representative and also two
terms as mayor of Orleans be-
tween 1944 and 1950.

He is survived by one son,

Herman B. Sherk

Herman B. Sherk, only son of
the Rev. Noah and Lydia Sherk,
was born April 17, 1868, at Car-
lyle, Pa. and, following a heart
attack, died at the Holy Family
hospital in Estherville at 9:30
p.m. Sept. 14, 1954. He was 86
years, four months and 14 days
old at the time of his death.

Jan. 16, 1890, he was married
to Lizzie Koch. Seven of the nine
children in this family survive
their father. The first Mrs. Sherk
died March 14, 1924.

Nov. 22, 1927, Herman Sherk
and Minnie Bell Byers were
married in Chicago, Ill.

Mr. Sherk lived in Pennsyl-
vania during his childhood and
moved with his parents to Iowa
in 1876. He was graduated from
Lisbon high school in 1885 and
attended Cornell college in Mt.
Vernon. Before choosing farming
as his career he taught rural
school, worked as a dentist's ap-
prentice and clerked in a grocery
store. He farmed first in Hardin
county and moved to Dickinson
county in 1895 and lived on a
farm northwest of Spirit Lake
from that date until he moved to
the town of Spirit Lake in 1945.

He was active in all farm or-
ganizations. He was Spirit Lake
township director of the Farmers'
Mutual Insurance company for
46 years, was president of the
Federal Land bank of Dickinson
county for many years and was
one of the early presidents of
the Dickinson county Farm
Bureau.

He was the oldest elder of the
First Presbyterian church of
Spirit Lake in years of service
and in age. He was a delegate of
the Northwest Synod of Iowa to
the general assembly of the Pres-
byterian church in Rochester,
New York, in 1940.

They resided at Spencer and Lawler and ten years ago moved to Spirit Lake. Mr. Zipse farmed for a time, was employed as a carpenter and was also a licensed healer. One son was born to this union.

He served as mayor of Arleans, Iowa for two years.

Surviving are his wife; one son, Floyd Adell Zipse; 1 grandchild, Debra Dellena Zipse and three bro- thers, Edward of New Hampton, Myron of Charles City and Arthur of Waterloo.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one sister, Mrs. Henry (Martha) Weidler.
