C.E.R. Fuester, 97, of Ida Grove, a former member of the Iowa House of Representatives and former Ida County supervisor, died July 1 at a Denison hospital.

Funeral services were held July 3 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Ida Grove, with the Rev. S.W. Holstein, chaplain at the Eventide Nursing Home in Denison officiating. Burial was in Ida Grove Cemetery under direction of Christensen Funeral Home of Ida Grove.

Mr. Fuester was born May 17, 1876 in Blue Island, Ill. He married Mary Burk on Oct. 20, 1897 in Grant Township, Iowa where he farmed. He served as

clerk of Grant Township for 12 years and as Ida County supervisor for six years. He was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives from Ida County in 1932 on the Democratic ticket and served for four years. After he retired from farming, he sold insurance. Mrs. Fuester died Feb. 5, 1963. He has been a resident of the Eventide Nursing Home for the past 10 years.

Survivors include two sons, Herbert of San Antonio, Texas, and Walter of Haddonfield, N.J.; one daughter, Mrs. Florence Pedersen of San Francisco, Calif.; six grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Sophie Fowler of Elk Point.

of scheduled traffic violations and a fixed amount for the fines, which are printed on the uniform citation to be issued by law enforcement officers.

These scheduled violations and the amount of the fines are: illegal parking, \$2; registration or license plate violation, \$5; improper lights, \$10; defective muffler, \$10; other defective equipment, \$10; speeding up to 10 miles per hour over the limit, \$20; leaving motor running unattended, \$10; failure to dim, \$10; failure to use right-of-way, \$20; license, \$20; stopping on traveled portion of highway, \$20; and

If the violator wishes to plead not guilty, he may do so either at the Clerk of Court's office or by mail and post a bond equal to 1½ times the amount of the stated fine plus the court costs.

For non-scheduled violations, violations resulting in an accident or injury, violations that are deemed hazardous or aggravating or other circumstances the violator must appear before the Magistrate.

Any violator may be tried before the Magistrate or request a trial by jury.
