The Rev. Cecil A. Wells, 75, 1526 Stafford Ave., died Wednesday, Feb. 9, at the Mary Greeley Medical Center. Services will be 1:30 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 12, from the First United Methodist Church, Sixth Street and Kellogg Avenue.

Cecil Wells was born June 25, 1907, in Oklahoma Territory to Hazel and Frank Wells. He grew up in Woodward, Okla., and graduated from the Oklahoma City University in 1929 and Garrett Theological Seminary, Evanston, Ill., in 1932. On March 26, 1933, he was married to Jeannette (Janet) Irene Urbauer in Naperville, Ill.

Rev. Wells retired from the full-time Methodist ministry in 1976. He began his retirement years in Ames and became assistant to the pastors at the First United Methodist Church.

He celebrated 50 years of service to the United Methodist ministry in 1979.

For eleven years Rev. Wells served churches in Hitchcock, Bartlesville and Delaware in the Oklahoma conference. In 1940 he came to Iowa and served at Sidney from 1940-1944; at Albia from 1944-1948 and at Des Moines Union Park United Methodist from 1948 to 1958.
