Mr. Johnson was graduated from Iowa State College in 1915. He served in the Iowa House of Representatives in 1930; was a former member of the Albert City Farmers Elevator board; was area president of the Federal Land Bank of Omaha; had taught at Waldorf Junior College and was a retired farmer. He was an ardent sportsman in hunting, fishing and golf.

Mr. Walker was a member of Grace United Methodist church of Spencer.

Surviving are his widow, Dessie; a son, George C. Johnson of Clearwater, Fla.; two daughters, Mrs. Dean (Dorothy) Vaubel of Dysart, Ia., and Mrs. Betty I Hamilton of New York City, N.Y.; two grandchildren and two sisters, Mrs. Jennie Benna of Fort Dodge and Mrs. Ellen Larson of Storm Lake.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers and two sisters.

New program

Three new programs were given approval by the Board of Directors of Iowa Lakes Community College at the regular monthly meeting held Tuesday night. The instructional programs that will be added to the curriculum starting with the fall quarter are environmental technician and data processing specialist.

The environmental technician program which will be offered by the science department, is a two-year career-oriented program that prepares a student for employment immediately upon completion of the program or for transfer to a four-year institution to work toward a B.S. degree in environmental technology. The program at Iowa Lakes will prepare an individual to run analyses in water, waste-water systems and advise in all aspects of water quality.
