E. L. Stewart, Former State Legislator, Taken by Death; Active in Church Work

Everett Lloyd Stewart, 66, former member of the state legislature and prominent farm and church leader in this community, died at 8:30 Saturday evening at his home, four miles northeast of town, in the Living Lake community. He had been ill since February 23, with a brain tumor. After undergoing surgery in an Iowa City hospital he made a steady improvement for some weeks, but suffered a relapse. He had been bedfast for the last six weeks.

Funeral services will be held at three o'clock Tuesday afternoon in the chapel at the United Presbyterian church, a room that he was instrumental in having provided at this church during recent remodeling operations. His pastor, Dr. E. L. Haney, will conduct the services. Burial will be at Elm Grove cemetery. Funeral arrangements are in charge of Sherman's funeral home.

Mr. Stewart was born Feb. 9, 1885, on the same farm where he died, a son of W. Allen and Margaret (McLaughlin) Stewart. His home had always been on this farm.

Graduate of Ames

He was graduated from Washington academy, attended Monmouth college for one year, and was a graduate of Iowa State college at Ames, in the class of 1909. He was married March 15, 1913, at Des Moines, to Jessie White, who survives him.

Mr. Stewart was a member of the Washington United Presbyterian church, where he had been very active in the work of the congregation. For 24 years he was an elder in this church and was serving as a member of the board of trustees at the time of his death. He was chairman of the special building committee that directed ex-

tensive remodeling of the church's interior during the past two years. Served in Legislature

From 1935 to 1943 Mr. Stewart served as Washington county's representative in the Iowa General assembly at Des Moines. He was past president of the Washington county Farm Bureau. He was a member of the County board of education from the time of its organization until he resigned a few weeks ago because of his illness.

Besides his wife his

survivors include four daughters: Mrs. Truman Tuttle (Margaret) of Cedar Rapids; Mrs. Lewis Williams (Kathryn) of Los Angeles; Mrs. David Scott (Frances) of Springfield, Mo., and Mrs. William Mennier (Helen) of Virginia Beach, Va. There are three grandchildren.

Mr. Stewart is also survived by two brothers and two sisters: Miss Mazie Stewart of Washington, John A. Stewart of Washington, Mrs. R. F. Galloway of Cedar Rapids and Gloyce C. Stewart of Washington.

Everett L. Stewart was born in Washington County, Iowa, February 9, 1885, on the same farm where he died June 23, 1951. His home had always been on this farm where his father and uncle cleared the land after the Civil War.

He received his early education in the rural school and was graduated from Washington Academy, attended Monmouth College, Monmouth, Illinois, for one year and graduated from the Iowa State College at Ames in the class of 1909. For several years after his graduation he was with the Extension Service of the college during the winter months judging corn at their institutes and traveling with the "corn train."

He was united in marriage March 15, 1913, at Des Moines, Iowa, to Jessie M. White and to this union were born four daughters, who are now Mrs. T. E. Tuttle, Mrs. Lewis Williams, Mrs. David Scott, and Mrs. W. F. Monnier. These daughters and his wife survive him.

Mr. Stewart was a member of the Washington United Presbyterian Church, where he had been very active in the work of the congregation. He taught the Men's Bible Class and for 24 years was an elder in this church and was serving as a member of the board of trustees at the time of his death. He was chairman of the special building committee that directed extensive remodeling of the church's interior.

From 1934 to 1942 Mr. Stewart served as Washington County's Representative in the General Assembly. In politics he was a Republican.

PAUL E. STILLMAN

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Paul E. Stillman, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Paul E. Stillman was born in Chicago, Illinois, November 4, 1868. He was the son of E. B. and Elizabeth Bowman Stillman. He attended school in Chicago, and then at Waucoma, Iowa, where his father engaged in the business of milling. He later attended high school at the Chicago Manual Training School.

He came with his parents to Iowa in 1856, and resided in Iowa City, Des Moines and Sioux City. His father established the Sioux City Journal in 1863. Following that, he returned to Chicago and operated a printing establishment until the great Chicago fire, after which the Stillmans returned to Iowa and to Waucoma.

In 1884 he became associated in the publication of The Jefferson Bee.

Mr. Stillman entered the University of Michigan in 1887, graduating in 1891 with a degree of Bachelor of Arts. He purchased an interest in The Jefferson Bee that year and became active in its publication with his brother, Frank.

He served three terms, from 1907 to 1911, in the House of Representatives, being Speaker of the House in the Thirty-fourth General Assembly. In 1914 he was temporary chairman of the Republican state con-


