## Young Athlete Shot in Accident

The condition of Bob Noble, Hawarden high school basketball player who was shot in the leg in a hunting accident Sunday afternoon, was reported as "very good" by the attending physician yesterday.

Young Noble was shot just above the knee from close range while one of his companions was fumbling his gun before getting into the car.

The shot entered the rear of Noble's leg, shattering the inside part of the femur and barely missing some large blood vessels. With him at the time of the accident were three other high school athletes, John Harmelink, Roger Ahmann and Roger Strong. The boys, who had been hunting about four miles north of Hawarden, rushed Noble to the Hawarden hospital.

Although Noble will be able to use his leg, the attending physician said there still was some question about how much recovery could be expected for the future.
