WILLIAM JOHN JOHANNES

William John Johannes, age 87, of Ashton, died Friday, May 28, at the Osceola Community Hospital in Sibley. Services were held Monday, May 30, at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Ashton. Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery in Ashton with full military services.

He was born Feb. 18, 1890, the son of Jacob and Clara Ludwig Johannes in Ashton. He graduated from St. Joseph's High School in Ashton and Mankato Business College. He served in the AEF during World War I and was a 50-year member of the American Legion.

In 1914 he entered the banking business in Sibley. In 1919 he began work as a cashier at the Ashton State Bank. In 1956 he became president of this bank until his retirement. He served 10 terms as State Representative from Osceola County. He held an Honorary Membership in the Iowa Press Association. In 1920 he was married to Rosemary Oppenorth, a nurse in World War I, from Kewaskein, Wis.

Survivors include three daughters: Mary Clare Shupe of Elmhurst, Ill.; Eileen Martel of Lynn, Mass.; and Dorothy Johannes of Ashton; five grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; and three sisters: Anna Arning, Beth Seivert and Helen Johannes, all of Ashton.

He was preceded in death by his wife, two brothers, four sisters, and a grandson.
