## talk salaries

A committee of Chariton Community School District teachers will appear at the Wednesday meeting of the board of education to discuss salaries for the coming year.

Also on the agenda for the school board tomorrow night at the special meeting of the board is a discussion of the salary for the summer special education drivers.

The board will also take more resignations and transfers, and will review the school district's athletic program. The head coaches

from the high school will be at the meeting.

Other items on the agenda include an amendment to the 1973-1974 school year budget and a discussion of minimum wage requirements.

The board will also hold hearing on the proposed plans and specifications and proposed form of contract for the electrical re-wiring of the high school building.

The board will then open bids for the first phase of the re-wiring, according to superintendent of schools Dr. Harold Westra.

## Harold Levis dies Saturday

Harold Levis, former district judge and one of Chariton's most prominent citizens, died Saturday night at Chariton Manor, where he had lived for several years.

Memorial services were held this afternoon at the United Methodist Church with the Rev. Merrill D. Summerbell conducting. Burial was in the Chariton Cemetery.

After graduation from the University of Iowa he received a law degree from Drake University.

He was a high school teacher in Chariton for a short period; a practicing attorney, county attorney, state senator and district judge.

Mr. Levis was a World War I veteran, receiving the Croix

De Guerre medal awarded by France for heroism, and was an active American Legion member.

Mr. Levis owned a farm and was one of the early promoters in the area of soil conservation.

He was involved in many civic activities, particularly with the Boy Scouts of America and in the United Methodist Church. He served the church as a Sunday School teacher, board member, trustee and in other positions.

Mrs. Levis preceded him in death. He is survived by two sons, Robert of Los Angeles, Calif., and James of Mason City and nine grandchildren.

Memorials have been established to the First United Methodist Church.
