STRICKLER, 66, DIES OF CANCER

Milton W. Strickler, lawyer, a onetime acting city manager, and a former Polk County representative in the Iowa Legislature, died of cancer Tuesday night at Iowa Methodist Hospital. He was 66.



Born at Warrenton, Va., he had lived here since 1925. He and his wife, Reba, and a son, William, a student at Roosevelt High School, lived at 2905 Thirty-eighth st.

He also is survived by another son, Richard, a Des Moines attorney who lives at 810 Polk blvd.

Mr. Strickler was acting city manager from Nov. 27, 1956, until Jan. 1, 1957. He served as city corporation counsel from August, 1956, until May, 1958, retaining that title during his interim appointment as city manager.

Political Activity

He was discharged as chief legal adviser by majority vote of the City Council in May of 1958. In 1959 he campaigned for the alderman plan of municipal government, which was defeated.

Mr. Strickler was a representative in the 1937 Legislature. He was an unsuccessful candidate for the Republican nomination for governor in 1944.

In 1938, and in 1940 he was defeated for the Republican nomination for Polk County attorney, and in 1954, he ran unsuccessfully for the State Senate.

He received his law degree

from Georgetown University in Washington, D. C., and also attended American University and National University in Washington.

U. S. Posts

After overseas service in World War I, he was an auditor in the U. S. Treasury Department. In 1923, he was appointed director of naturalization for Iowa, Missouri and Oklahoma, with headquarters in St. Louis, Mo. He resigned in 1925 to come to Des Moines to practice law.

He was a former state commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and a member of the American Legion, Masons, Elks, Eagles, the Polk County Bar Association and the

Iowa State Bar Association

He was a member of the law firm of Strickler, Bellizzi and Rosenberg.

He pleaded guilty and was sentenced by Urbandale Police Judge Walker Johnston.


Crossed Median

MILTON W. STRICKLER

MR. SPEAKER: - Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Milton W. Strickler, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Milton W. Strickler was born at Warrenton, Virginia, on January 17, 1897. After high school he obtained the following college degrees: Bachelor of Laws, Master of Laws and Master of Patent Laws, from the National University in Washington, D. C.

He married Gladyce J. Fisher of Weschester, Iowa, and they had a son, Richard A. Strickler of Des Moines. They were later divorced. In 1943 he married Reba L. Rice. To this union was born a son, William Strickler, also of Des Moines.

Mr. Strickler was a member of the American expeditionary forces to France during World War I. Following the war, he was employed by the United States Treasury Department as an auditor in Washington, and in 1921 was appointed to the general accounting office. In 1923 he was appointed director of naturalization for Iowa, Missouri and Oklahoma, stationed in St. Louis, Missouri. He resigned this position in 1925 to engage in the practice of law in Des Moines.

Mr. Strickler, a Republican, served in the Iowa House of Representatives in the Forty-seventh General Assembly as representative of Polk County.

Mr. Strickler passed away on March 26, 1963.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SIXTY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF IOWA: That in the passing of the Honorable Milton W. Strickler, the state has lost an honored citizen and a faithful and useful public servant, and the House by this resolution would express its appreciation of his service, and tender its sympathy to the members of his family.

Milton W. Strickler, b. 1-17-1897, near Warrenton, VA, at 18 graduated at Bealeton, VA High, attended a Business College in Washington, D.C., enlisted in U.S. Army 1917, served in France, suffered injuries from which he has never entirely recovered, returned to civil life Feb. 1919, studied law, graduating from the National and American Universities with three degrees, LL.B, MP.L. and LL.M., appointed Auditor in U. S. Treasury Dept., 1919, appointed attorney for the U.S. Dept of Labor with offices at Des Moines, Iowa, which office he now holds. His fearless action in this office caused considerable newspaper comment in most of the mid-western papers. He is a Mason (Shriner, Almas Temple, Wash. D.C.). It has been said of him that he never smiled until he was about 12 years old but in the West he is known as the man with the sunny Virginia smile. Evidently he was conserving his smiles for the future, for his friends are legion. He is an indefatigable worker, good mixer, and a thorough student. He is the thirteenth child and seventh son of his father. His permanent address is Midland, VA.
