# Former Mayor Bulow, 70, Dies

## Barber in Clinton For Many Years

Harry F. Bulow, 70, of 721 S. 6th St., former mayor of Clinton and member of the Iowa State House of Representatives, died this morning in Des Moines at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Genevieve Frye, with whom he had been visiting for the past two weeks.

A barber in Clinton for many years, Bulow was also a member of the 47th General Assembly and the Clinton board of education. He was president of the Master Barbers association of Clinton and member of the Master Barbers association of America.

He was born in Clinton Sept. 21, 1884, the son of Frederick and Hannah Hagedorn Bulow. His wife preceded him in death June 21.

The body will be brought to the Snell funeral home and a complete obituary will be announced later.

County Attorney Warren C.  
Johnson told the court of Deets'  
violent efforts to escape after  
he had been arrested in his for-  
mer wife's apartment which he  
had broken into in violation of  
an injunction granted at the  
time of the divorce three weeks  
ago. The break-in occurred after  
Deets had made violent threats  
against his ex-wife at the north-  
end restaurant where she is em-  
ployed as a cook, Johnson said,  
which resulted in a call to po-  
lice and the ensuing disturbance  
charge.

The county attorney pointed  
out that three officers had been  
injured in Deets' attempts to es-  
cape, and said he thought it im-  
portant to establish a respect for  
law and order and a public policy  
regarding the duties of officers  
when seeking to enforce the law.

Johnson said he recommended  
a jail sentence. Resisting an of-  
ficer is an indictable misdemea-  
nor and is punishable by a sen-  
tence of up to a year in jail, a  
fine of \$50 to \$1,000 or both.

Pending sentence, the judge  
set bond of \$700, in lieu of which
