### Services set for Hauge

Services for Herbert H. Hauge, 72, of 536 Twenty-ninth St. will be at noon Monday at Hamilton's Funeral Home. Burial will be in Resthaven Cemetery.

Mr. Hauge died at his home of a heart attack Wednesday. An attorney, he retired from practice five years ago. He was a lifelong Des Moines resident.

Mr. Hauge served in the Legislature from 1939 to 1941. He was a member of the Iowa Board of Control of State Institutions from 1946 to 1949. He ran for state senator from Polk County in 1958 and state representative in 1968.

He attended St. Olaf's College at Northfield, Minn., and received his law degree from the University of Iowa. He also farmed in Story County.

He was a veteran of World War II, a member of the Iowa State Bar Association, Polk County Bar Association, American Legion, Iowa State DeMolay, Za-Ga-Zig Shrine, Scottish Rite Bodies, Home Lodge 370, Des Moines Pioneer Club and Central Lutheran Church.

There are no immediate survivors.
