## Evidence Under Lock

A recent disappearance of millions of dollars worth of heroin from the New York City Police Department has not had much effect on the Council Bluffs police security.

Chief Nick Sulentic said Friday no evidence has ever been found missing from his department.

"Our evidence is strictly the responsibility of the Identification Bureau," he said. "They are the keepers of the keys."

"We've found that if a chain of evidence passes through too many hands, it's hard to keep it all intact.

"Our biggest problem in handling evidence is the make-up of our building," said Sulentic. "We're really cramped."

Sulentic said his department is doing the best job it can in protecting evidence. He said the ideal situation would be walk-in "vaults" where evidence could

## Insurance Proceeds May Soon Be Fixed In Variable Dollars

**NEW YORK (AP)**—The bed-rock belief on which the life insurance industry is built, the assured fixed-precise return, has shifted. Soon you may have the option of accepting your proceeds in variable rather than fixed dollars.

The change, cleared this week by a Securities and Exchange Commission decision, introduces into life insurance the chance of actually earning money on your insurance rather than merely obtaining security and some savings.

The low-risk element is essentially still there, because a minimum return is guaranteed.
