DR. W. MIGHELL DIES IN CALIFORNIA

Dr. W. Mighell passed away December 6, 1961, at his home in Long Beach, California. He was born at Ames, Iowa, August 28, 1874, the third son of Alice Newton Mighell and Thaddeus Stevens Mighell. He moved with his parents and brothers to a farm in Douglas township, Ida County, Iowa, in 1884.

He studied Mechanical Engineering for more than three years at Ames, Iowa, but on being interrupted by serious illness, returned to the farm. He was married to Sadie Gleason April 10, 1901. He was graduated from Medical college at Iowa City, Iowa, in 1908 and practiced medicine for seven years at Colville, Wash. He returned to northwest Iowa where he farmed for several years, and did some medical practice. Both his and his wife's parents were early pioneers in Iowa. He was of the 9th generation of Deacon Thomas Mighell of Plymouth Colony in 1636.

Dr. Mighell joined the Masons in Iowa City in 1908 and was a lifetime member of the Little Sioux Lodge No. 521 at Washta. He served in the State Senate of Iowa four years, 1937-1941. He and his wife moved to California in 1946 and have been residents of Long Beach since that time. He was a member of the Unitarian Church for many years both in Washta and in Long Beach.

He is survived by his wife and three children, a son Ronald in Silver Springs, Maryland, and

two daughters, Winifred (Mrs. George Mathews) of Danville, Iowa, and Helen (Mrs. Charles Hodde) of Olympic Washington. Services were held on Saturday, December 9, with burial at Westminster cemetery in Long Beach, Calif.
